February 23, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 6:33pm by Chairman Castellano who requested Legislator Gouldman lead in the Pledge of Allegiance. Upon roll call Legislator Gouldman and Chairman Castellano were present. Legislator Ellner was absent. Castellano stated Legislator Nacerino would sit on the Committee in the absence of Legislator Ellner.

Item #3 - Acceptance of Minutes - December 20, 2022 & January 30, 2023

The minutes were accepted as submitted.

Item #4 - Correspondence/County Auditor

a. Sales Tax Report

Legislator Gouldman stated the numbers for January are higher than they were last year, which is a positive sign.

Legislator Montgomery requested that the numbers be stated for the record.

Chairman Castellano stated the sales tax revenue for January 2023 is \$6,673,020.

Item #5 - Correspondence/ Commissioner of Finance

- Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 22A089/ Highway/ Adjust Capital Budget/ Stoneleigh/Drewville Intersection Project (Also reviewed in Physical)

Commissioner Carlin stated this amendment will match the books to the supplemental agreement previously approved.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

c. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 22A090/ Highway/ Adjust Capital Budget/ Drewville Road Bridge Replacement Project (Also reviewed in Physical)

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Nacerino. All in favor.

d. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 22A091/ Finance/ Year End Journal Entry #2

Commissioner Carlin stated this budgetary amendment corrects year end accounts.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

e. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A004/ Bureau of Emergency Services/ Grant Award/ FY2022 State Homeland Security Program (SHSP) (Also reviewed in Protective)

Legislator Nacerino made a motion to waive the rules and accept the additional; Seconded by Chairman Castellano. All in favor.

Chief Deputy Commissioner of Finance Michael Lewis stated this is comprised of two (2) components, one (1) is a Chevy Tahoe to be used as an emergency response vehicle for \$56,731. He stated both current emergency response vehicles are 11 years old and both have over 75,000 miles and are used 24/7/365.

Legislator Montgomery questioned if this vehicle is for the not-for-profit organization REACT.

Commissioner Carlin stated he does not believe so. He stated these vehicles are used by the Bureau of Emergency Services.

Legislator Montgomery questioned if the County is purchasing a vehicle for REACT.

Commissioner Carlin stated yes, the County is purchasing a vehicle for REACT, but this vehicle is for the Bureau of Emergency Services.

Legislator Gouldman questioned if the vehicle price includes being fit with all the necessary equipment.

Chief Deputy Commissioner Lewis stated he would defer to Interim Commissioner of the Bureau of Emergency Services Bob Lipton, but he believes the vehicle will come with all equipment installed. Legislator Gouldman stated it was mentioned that these vehicles have been used to transport doctors to work during weather events. He questioned how residents can utilize this service.

Commissioner Carlin stated that is a question for the Bureau of Emergency Services.

Sheriff Kevin McConville stated in a situation where medical professionals need to get to their workplace, emergency responders will chip in to transport them.

Chairman Castellano stated there have been a few storms in the past couple of years where the roads were difficult to travel on. He stated he believed contacting the Bureau of Emergency Services would be the best way to arrange travel for medical personnel.

Commissioner Carlin stated the approval of this expenditure needs to be approved by both the County and the State.

Chairman Castellano stated the \$121,731 includes the Chevrolet Tahoe, 2 UTVs (utility task vehicle), and 1 trailer to transport the UTVs.

Legislator Montgomery stated in May 2022 the Protective Services Committee considered a 2021 SHSP Grant. She questioned if this is the same thing.

Commissioner Carlin stated yes, but it is a different program year. He stated there may be different expenditures.

Legislator Montgomery stated the grant considered last year states that it is for vehicles.

Chief Deputy Commissioner Lewis stated there is always a lag, the award letter was not received until September 26, 2022

Commissioner Carlin stated the Federal fiscal year begins on October 1st.

Legislator Montgomery questioned what contracts the \$70,000 will be for.

Chief Deputy Commissioner Lewis stated the contracts are for the ERT (Emergency Response Team) training in the Sheriff's Department, the Town of Kent and Town of Carmel.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Nacerino. All in favor.

f. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A005/ Finance/ Account for State Aid from NYS Office of Indigent Legal Services/ Pass Through to Legal Aid Society (Also reviewed in Protective)

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

g. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A006/ Sheriff's Dept./ Grant Award from NYS Dept. of Criminal Justice/ 20 BWC (Also reviewed in Protective)

Legislator Nacerino made a motion to waive the rules and accept the additional; Seconded by Chairman Castellano. All in favor.

Legislator Nacerino stated the additional material is in response to her inquiry regarding the maintenance and installation.

Chief Deputy Commissioner Lewis stated the Sheriff's Department was awarded a one (1) time grant of \$40,000 to purchase the body worn cameras (BWC). He stated this will cover the cost of an additional 20 body cameras at \$2,000 each. He stated although the grant will only cover the purchase this year, the vendor has agreed to honor the same cost for years 2, 3, and 4.

Legislator Montgomery stated in the past a policy has been required prior to any purchase of equipment like this, for example the license plate readers (LPR). She stated a policy for the BWC has not been presented to the Legislature. She stated footage captured on the BWC is sensitive and it is important to have the policy in place. She provided an example of an officer entering a school and possibility having to go into a restroom where students might be.

Legislator Jonke questioned if the BWC are on at all times.

Sheriff Kevin McConville stated no, they have to be activated. He stated the Sheriff's Department met with all the school Superintendents and one (1) requested to see the policy however they are not entitled to see it because it is an operational policy. He stated the industry standards are followed and they worked very closely with the PBA and incorporated their recommendations into the policy. He stated the policy is very thorough and fair and articulates the law enforcement activity that would be documented when a member of the Sheriff's Department is engaging with the public. He stated there are restrictions on use of the BWC for certain interactions to ensure privacy and security.

Legislator Jonke stated the main reason to use the BWC is for the safety of both the officers and the public.

Sheriff McConville stated since using BWC there has been a reduction in personnel complaints. He stated the BWC have already proven to be invaluable and they were fortunate that were in use during a recent deputy involved shooting incident. He stated there have been no complaints about the operation of the cameras.

Chairman Castellano stated the presence of the camera might dissuade a member of the public from exaggerating what occurred.

Legislator Nacerino stated in terms of the policy for the LPR, there were many issues to consider such as privacy, the chain of command within the department and who had authority over the information. She stated with regard to the BWC policy, the PBA (Police Benevolent Association) was adamant about having structure to this. She stated the fact that they have agreed to implement this and wear the cameras is really an indication of how they feel about it.

Legislator Montgomery stated she does not understand the difference between having a policy for the LPR and not having a policy for the BWC. She stated it is her understanding that the PBA has not yet signed onto this.

Legislator Nacerino stated the PBA has agreed to wear the cameras.

Legislator Montgomery stated she would like to see the document signed by the PBA that they have agreed to wear them. She questioned why the policy for the LPR was so important that it held up the use of them for almost a year and why there is no policy for the BWC. She stated the reason for the Police Policy Review Panel was to have these policies available. She stated she does not want to misrepresent her position; she is in favor of the BWC. She stated this is not a discussion about the importance of using a BWC, it is about the importance of policy. She stated there is a difference between operational procedures and policy. She stated operational procedures are for the department only where the policy is something the Legislature has a say in. She questioned if the Sheriff and/or his command staff wears a BWC.

Legislator Jonke stated the purchase of the LPR through grant funding required the policy to be in place. He stated in this case, the Sheriff's Department already has the BWC. He stated he believes comparing the two is like comparing apples or oranges.

Chairman Castellano stated this is the Sheriff's policy to develop with the PBA. He stated is in support of utilizing the BWC as they are a vital tool that benefit everyone. He stated the LPR could record information on a much broader scale, involving the entire public. He stated the Sheriff stated that the PBA has agreed to wear these cameras.

Sheriff McConville stated the LPRs that were in place prior to his administration taking office had no agreements with the pole owner, cable company, or NYS DOT (New York State Department of Transportation), which are all mandated in order to put an LPR on a telephone pole. He stated over the course of three and a half months they secured

those agreements. He stated there were three (3) LPRs and were in Garrison, Nelsonville, and Cold Spring. He stated there was no documentation authorizing the use of those LPRs so they stopped utilizing them until the agreements were all in place. He stated once that was complete, they worked with NYSEG. He stated the Sheriff's Department is the first law enforcement agency in New York State that NSYEG has given approval to for LPRs to be installed on their poles. He stated as far as BWC, there is a clear delineation of what law enforcement activity can and cannot be documented. He stated in the policy it is articulated that whenever the officer is engaging in public interaction, they are required to inform the individuals that they are wearing a BWC. He stated the policy also speaks to confidentiality and restrictions on viewing the footage. He stated the PBA and its membership has the ability to review incidents as they write the report so it is more factual.

Legislator Montgomery questioned if the Legislature will see the policy for the BWC.

Chairman Castellano stated at this point he does not believe its necessary.

Sheriff McConville stated they met with CEPAB (Community Engagement & Police Advisory Board) and discussed the use of the BWC but the policy was not shared with them.

Legislator Nacerino stated the explanation of why a policy is not being provided is clear.

Legislator Montgomery stated it is not transparent.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Nacerino. All in favor.

Item #6 – Approval/ Fund Transfer 22T418/ Dept. of Social Services/ NYS Office of Children & Family Services Chargeback for Placement in State Facility from 4/8/21-12/31/21 (Also reviewed in Health)

Commissioner Carlin stated this fund transfer is not necessary as it was included in the Year End Entry (Budgetary Amendment 22A091).

Item #7 – Approval/ Fund Transfer 23T017/ Office for Senior Resources/ Building Rental (Also reviewed in Health)

Legislator Montgomery questioned if this rent has been being paid from three (3) different budget lines.

Chief Deputy Commissioner of Finance Michael Lewis stated the 2023 budget allocated these funds amongst 3 programs.

Commissioner Carlin stated in the beginning it was in one line, but as it has evolved they found it easier to put it into lines that the federal claims were against for each

program. He stated \$165,000 is the annual rent that is being spread out among the budget lines.

Legislator Montgomery stated she thought the rent was \$11,000 per month, although that may have been the amount from 2019.

Commissioner Carlin stated the rent increases each year.

Chairman Castellano stated the monthly rent is currently \$13,296.

Legislator Montgomery stated it would be great to use the building for more purposes.

Chairman Castellano agreed. He stated he spoke with the County Clerk and he is willing to operate services from that building. He stated right now, the County leases it but it can only be used by the Office for Senior Resources.

Legislator Montgomery stated she approached the previous administration with an idea for a program in the building and she was turned down.

Chairman Castellano stated he believes the town has the final say. He stated he would like to see more services being provided from that location.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

Item #8 – Approval/ Fund Transfer 23T033/ Planning/ Reclass Position from Planner II to Principal Planner Effective 1/1/2023 (Also reviewed in Personnel)

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Nacerino. All in favor.

Item #9 – Approval/ Application for Correction of Assessment Rolls & Tax Rolls/ Town of Carmel Tax Map #54.8-1-55.1, 55.2, & 55.3

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

Item #11 – Approval/ Town of Putnam Valley American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) & Sales Tax Funding Reallocation

Legislator Gouldman stated the Town of Putnam Valley has requested that some of their ARPA funding be reallocated for needed projects: phosphorus reduction in Watershed area (\$483,120) and the replacement of Bell Hollow Bridge (\$1,000,000). He stated this reallocation would be greatly appreciated by the Town. He stated he will be supporting this request and he hopes his colleagues will as well.

Legislator Nacerino stated her support for Legislator Montgomery's previous request for the executive summaries for grants to be included in the backup material. She stated it will be helpful to understand what is being approved.

Legislative Counsel Firriolo when the procedure for requests for modifications to the funding is for the town to check with Commissioner Carlin that the projects are in compliance with the APRA guidelines. He stated the request would then go to the County Executive and then to the Legislature for approval.

Legislator Gouldman made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Nacerino. All in favor.

The meeting was called to order at 6:50pm by Chairman Castellano who requested Legislator Gouldman lead in the Pledge of Allegiance. Upon roll call Legislators Ellner and Gouldman and Chairman Castellano were present.

Item #3 - Correspondence/County Auditor

a. Sales Tax Report

Legislator Gouldman stated the County has collected about \$1 million more in sales tax revenue as compared to the same time period in 2022.

Legislator Ellner questioned if the revenue on the spreadsheet for January and February 2023 were estimates or actual numbers.

Commissioner Carlin stated the spreadsheet lists the actual numbers.

Legislator Montgomery requested that the numbers be read into the record.

Chairman Castellano stated the sales tax revenue collected in February 2023 is \$5,979,925 which is up \$932,334 over February 2022.

Item #4 – Correspondence/ Commissioner of Finance

a. Overtime/Temporary Report - Duly Noted

b. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 22A092/ Finance/ Year End Entry #3

Commissioner Carlin stated this is the last Year End Entry and it mainly closes out a lot of capital projects. He stated that included in this budgetary amendment is the \$2 million infusion into the capital reserve, which County Executive Byrne spoke about in his State of the County address. He stated this is money that cannot be spent until it is brought before the Legislature for approval. He stated these funds are recommended by the necessary department to the Legislature and they are approved via a CP (capital projects) resolution. He stated there are projects coming up that will request this funding at the Kohler Center and the 6N Highway Garage.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

c. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A009/ Dept. of Social Services & Mental Health/ Utilize Opioid Settlement Trust Monies to Fund Prevention Programs (Also reviewed in Health)

Legislator Montgomery stated she is happy to see funding going to the Prevention Council of Putnam so they can keep a position that had been funded through a grant. She stated she is looking forward to seeing what kind of proposals come in for the remainder of the Opioid Settlement money.

Commissioner Carlin stated the National Settlement Agreement has a list of approved uses for the funding. He stated the County has committed to using everything in the Settlement Funds for the approved uses.

Legislator Montgomery stated the approved uses are not restrictive; they leave a lot of room for interpretation.

Commissioner Carlin agreed, there are extensive approved uses.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

Item #5 - Approval/ Fund Transfer 23T048/ Finance/ Tilly's Table Insurance

Commissioner Carlin stated a post-audit was done. He stated Tilly's Table has had lots of activity and successful years and the insurance bill increases accordingly.

Chairman Castellano stated Tilly's Table is a great facility and he would like to see the continuation of its success.

Legislator Gouldman questioned if the County is indemnified on the insurance of the operator of Tilly's Table and the Putnam County Golf Course.

Commissioner Carlin suggested contacting Risk Manager Mat Bruno for the detailed insurance information. He stated the operators of the facilities have their own insurance as well.

Legislator Gouldman questioned why the County needs insurance if the operators' insurance indemnifies the County. He stated in the event of something happening, the business owner should be responsible for making the owner of the property whole.

Legislator Nacerino stated both the operator and the County each have an insurance policy.

Legislator Ellner stated the increased premium is due to increased sales and questioned what the increase was.

Commissioner Carlin stated there is a chart attached to the backup material showing the estimated exposure and audited exposure. He stated the bill is for both the Putnam County Golf Course and Tilly's Table.

Legislator Montgomery questioned how often the County shops around to change our insurance carrier.

Chief Deputy Commissioner of Finance Mike Lewis suggested directing that question to Risk Manager Bruno.

Commissioner Carlin stated the County's basic insurance policies are through NYMIR (New York Municipal Insurance Reciprocal).

Legislator Montgomery questioned if the insurance is renewed each year.

Commissioner Carlin stated that is correct.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Item #6 – Approval/ Fund Transfer 23T054/ Finance/ Office for Senior Resources/ Reclassification (Also reviewed in Personnel)

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to approve Fund Transfer 23T058; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

Item #9 – Approval/ Fund Transfer 23T067/ Sheriff's Dept./ Move Funds from Vehicle Purchase Line to Vehicle Lease Line (Also discussed in Protective)

Chairman Castellano stated leasing vehicles will result in a cost savings and provide the County with a better product in the long run.

Legislator Nacerino stated at the Protective Services Committee Meeting it was made clear that leasing vehicles is the best option for the County on a multitude of levels. She stated there is no cap on the mileage and the vehicles will be traded in, keeping the fleet in good condition. She stated she hopes the County begins utilizing electric vehicles as well.

Legislator Ellner stated the fleet will also be more fuel efficient.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

Item #11 – Local Law to Amend Chapter 41, Section 41-5 of the Code of Putnam County Entitled "Deposit & Investment Policy" Item #12 – FYI/ Signature Bank Update

Commissioner Carlin addressed items #11 & #12 together. He stated on March 12, 2023 Signature Bank was closed by the Federal Government due to a part of their bank being involved in a cryptocurrency which caused a run on the bank. He stated the funds Putnam County had in Signature Bank were safe for two (2) reasons: the Federal Government announced they would make all depositors whole and our investment policy requires that every bank we do business with collect collateral at 102% of market value. He stated the County had about \$36 million in the bank and the money was moved out. He stated moving the money was a swift and easy process. He stated the employees who service our accounts were great through the whole process. He stated the County is looking for new alternatives, one of which is a product called "Munivest", a municipal pool endorsed by NYSAC (New York State Association of Counties). He stated Signature

Bank has been removed from the list of depositories and funding levels have been adjusted accordingly.

Legislator Gouldman thanked Commissioner Carlin for his fast response to this issue.

Legislator Jonke thanked Commissioner Carlin for handling this situation well and putting him at ease when the news broke.

Commissioner Carlin stated Signature Bank was a good partner to work with.

Chairman Castellano questioned if there was a local branch of Signature Bank.

Commissioner Carlin stated there was one in Westchester.

Legislative Counsel Firriolo stated the final version of this local law may look a little different in format to comply with E-Code but will be substantially identical.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

Legislator Ellner questioned if the County would consider going back to Signature Bank now that it has been purchased.

Commissioner Carlin stated yes, once the sale is fully finalized and the County is able to go through all of the collateral and agreements.

Legislator Montgomery thanked Commissioner Carlin.

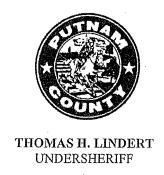

I. Purpose

The purpose of this Local Commissioner Memorandum (LCM) is to advise municipal youth bureaus on the availability of youth sports and education opportunity funding ("Sports Opportunity Funding").

This LCM provides notification of the 2023 program year allocation January 1, 2023, through September 30, 2023, for Sports Opportunity Funding.

II. Background

Part Y of Chapter 59 of the Laws of 2021 legalized mobile sports wagering in New York State. Subdivision 8 of section 1367 of the Racing, Pari-Mutuel Wagering and Breeding Law provides that \$5 million of state tax proceeds from mobile sports wagering are to be used to support annual grants for sports activities and education for youth. A grantmaking fund was created under the New York State Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) in the SFY 2022-2023 budget to provide awards to support sports programs for underserved children and youth younger than 18. The grants focus on supporting youth development via local nonprofit organizations and/or municipal-operated youth programs.

The allocation for this grant program provides \$3.75 million from the state tax imposed on mobile sports wagering for the period of January 1, 2023, through September 30, 2023.

III. Program Implications

Each municipal youth bureau will receive an allocation for the Sports Opportunity Funding to serve children and youth ages 6-17 based on the population of eligible youth in the county. These funds will be approved by OCFS and claimed in the same manner as the current Youth Development Program funding. Sports Opportunity Funding awards are guided by the following principles:

Sports are effective tools in positive youth development and family engagement.

- Sports improve the lives of young people by promoting positive social, emotional, health and educational outcomes and have important life-long effects.
- Sports enable opportunities for young people to thrive through leadership roles.
- Coaching education greatly improves young people's sports experience and development outcomes.

Funded programs must provide a variety of sports for a broad range of youth in under-resourced communities. OCFS encourages a wide and flexible definition of sports that includes organized activities with movement, including physical fitness activities including but not limited to yoga, hiking, dance, and active outdoors pursuits.

To ensure that funding is going to the intended population, municipal youth bureaus must distribute funds based on local need,¹ giving consideration to factors including but not limited to the following:

- Historically under-resourced communities
- Public housing
- High rates of family homelessness
- Opportunity Zones or neighborhoods/cities/areas deemed "low-income" via externally available tools like the New York State Council on Children and Families Kids' Well-Being Indicator Clearinghouse, etc.
- Marginalized communities or groups with higher barriers to participation in sports (e.g., youth with disabilities, girls, transgender/gender non-binary youth, lesbian, gay, bisexual and questioning identified youth)
- Federally and/or New York State-recognized tribes and tribal organizations
- Neighborhoods that experience higher rates of crime and violence and poorer performing schools

Additionally, municipal youth bureaus should give priority consideration to programs that serve youth identifying as Black, indigenous persons, and people of color and/or providers of adaptive sports for youth with physical disabilities.

All funded programs must aim to foster the following:

- Educational connection and achievement More youth attending and completing school with increased attainment, including programs that have collegiate placement success
- Physical health and well-being Increasing physical activity and positive relationships to one's body and physical activity
- Mental health and well-being Improving outcomes related to youth mental health and social and emotional skills development and connectedness
- Employment Increasing qualifications and skills, such as collective problem solving, teamwork and dispute resolution, which help prepare youth for suitable employment
- Community cohesion Breaking down barriers to reduce discrimination, crime and violence in communities and help young leaders emerge

Eligibility and Funding

Municipal youth bureaus will contract with local organizations, municipalities and/or local or municipal youth bureaus directly for up to \$50,000 per program. Organizations that serve multiple areas through different programs may be funded above \$50,000. Funding may provide general operating dollars to give programs flexibility to efficiently allocate resources for quality programming. Line-item budgets should focus on programming costs, including but not limited to the following:

- Coaches/instructors/direct service staff/mentors (including training/professional development)
- Equipment
- Educational programming costs
- Facility/field and/or space cost
- Maximum of 15% of funds for administrative/overhead costs for the implementing agency only

Programs eligible for funding must meet the criteria below:

- Provide structured sports activities for youth ages 6-17
- Serve youth in New York State
- Demonstrate basic competency in the areas of governance, monitoring and evaluation, partnership and financial stewardship
- Have a child protection policy in place that includes adherence to local city, agency, school district and state child protection guidelines
- Collect registration data, including participant demographic information, as required by OCFS in a manner that allows for accurate reporting of anonymized aggregate data

Organizations and activities not eligible for funding are the following:

- For-profit organizations or businesses
- Private foundations, as defined in section 509(a) of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code
- Organizations that discriminate based on age, ethnicity/race, political affiliation, religion, sexual
 orientation, gender, gender identity, physical or other disability, national origin or any protected
 characteristic under local, state and/or federal law
- Research or project planning activities
- Support for elite or private sports camps, programs, or teams
- Endowments, memorials, budget deficits, or fundraising activities
- Religious organizations whose sports programs do not have a secular and community focus
- Lobbying, political, or fraternal activities
- Capital projects

 - How Well: 0232B.4 % of youth completing the program
 - Better Off: 0232C.1 #/% reporting they have improved their ability to socialize/interact with peers/family/other members of the community

ISSA, the worldwide cleaning industry association, has partnered with the New York State Sheriffs' Association (NYSSA) to launch the first-ever statewide training and certification program for incarcerated individuals in New York's County jail system. Those incarcerated in the state's county jail system will now have the opportunity to be certified as experts on cleaning for health from ISSA's Cleaning Management Institute (CMI).

BOND RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY OF PUTNAM, NEW YORK, ADOPTED MAY 2, 2023, AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF VARIOUS PRE-K/EI VEHICLES AND RELATED EQUIPMENT; STATING THE ESTIMATED TOTAL COST THEREOF IS \$350,000; APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT THEREFOR; AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$350,000 SERIAL BONDS OF SAID COUNTY TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION.

THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF PUTNAM, NEW YORK, HEREBY RESOLVES (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Legislature) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The County of Putnam, New York (herein called "County"), is hereby authorized to acquire Pre-K/EI vehicles and related equipment. The estimated total cost of said class of objects or purposes, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, is \$350,000 and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$350,000 serial bonds of the County to finance said appropriation, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the County to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 2. Bonds of the County in the principal amount of \$350,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law"), to finance said appropriation.

Section 3. The period of probable usefulness of the class of objects or purposes for which said bonds are authorized to be issued pursuant to this resolution, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 29 of the Law, is five (5) years.

Section 4. The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be applied to reimburse the County for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

Section 5. Each of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity as prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, shall be general obligations of the County, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the County. The faith and credit of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the County by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 6. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law and pursuant to the provisions of Section 21.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bonds having substantially level or declining annual debt service, Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals thereof, and Sections 50.00, 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the County Legislature relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes, or the renewals thereof, and relative to providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, and prescribing the terms, form and contents, and as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized, and of any bond

anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said notes, as well as to executing agreements for credit enhancements, are hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance, the chief fiscal officer of the County.

Section 7. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:

- (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the County is not authorized to expend money, or
- (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution, or a summary thereof, are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
 - (c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.

Section 8. This bond resolution shall take effect upon the approval of the Putnam County Executive, and the Clerk of the County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to publish the foregoing resolution, in summary, together with a Notice attached in substantially the form prescribed by §81.00 of the Law in "*The Putnam Times*," a newspaper having a general circulation in the County and hereby designated as the official newspaper of the County for such publication.

BOND RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY OF PUTNAM, NEW YORK, ADOPTED MAY 2, 2023, AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF VARIOUS VEHICLES AND HEAVY EQUIPMENT FOR THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT; STATING THE ESTIMATED TOTAL COST THEREOF IS \$600,000; APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT THEREFOR; AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$600,000 SERIAL BONDS OF SAID COUNTY TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION.

THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF PUTNAM, NEW YORK, HEREBY RESOLVES (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Legislature) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The County of Putnam, New York (herein called "County"), is hereby authorized to acquire various vehicles and heavy equipment for the highway department. The estimated total cost of such class of objects or purposes, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, is \$600,000 and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$600,000 serial bonds of the County to finance said appropriation, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the County to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 2. Bonds of the County in the principal amount of \$600,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law"), to finance said appropriation.

Section 3. The period of probable usefulness of the class of objects or purposes for which said bonds are authorized to be issued pursuant to this resolution, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 28 of the Law, is fifteen (15) years.

Section 4. The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be applied to reimburse the County for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

Section 5. Each of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity as prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, shall be general obligations of the County, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the County. The faith and credit of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the County by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 6. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law and pursuant to the provisions of Section 21.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bonds having substantially level or declining annual debt service, Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals thereof, and Sections 50.00, 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the County Legislature relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes, or the renewals thereof, and relative to providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, and prescribing the terms, form and contents, and as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized, and of any bond

anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said notes, as well as to executing agreements for credit enhancements, are hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance, the chief fiscal officer of the County.

Section 7. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:

- (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the County is not authorized to expend money, or
- (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution, or a summary thereof, are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
 - (c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.

Section 8. This bond resolution shall take effect upon the approval of the Putnam County Executive, and the Clerk of the County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to publish the foregoing resolution, in summary, together with a Notice attached in substantially the form prescribed by §81.00 of the Law in "*The Putnam County Times*," a newspaper having a general circulation in the County and hereby designated as the official newspaper of the County for such publication.

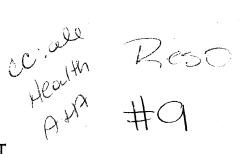

In January of 2023, the Department of Highways & Facilities made a request to the Personnel Department to conduct job analysis reviews of several positions throughout our department.

For several years, a number of employees in divisions of the department (Roads, Facilities, Parks and Recreation) have been paid for assignments to higher grade positions for which they are qualified, pursuant to the CSEA agreement, Article IV, Section 8. When needed, these employees work in titles higher than their budgeted titles and are paid the differential rate for these hours. For many, this may be done on a daily basis. This submission seeks to correct that situation by many of these recommendations.

With the rise in the cost of goods and outside bids, having – and retaining – a skilled staff is significant in completing capital projects in-house, saving the County tens of thousands of dollars.

In many of the classifications delineated below, the incumbents have also acquired additional higher-level licenses or certifications of their own volition. This is in addition to training arranged and provided through Local 60.

After all classification documents were considered, including details provided by each incumbent, their supervisors, and myself, the Personnel Department has recommended the following reclassifications:

- Assistant Maintenance Mason II to Maintenance Mason, Roads
- Road Maintenance Equipment Operator II to Assistant Maintenance Mason II, Roads
- Supervising Crew Chief to Supervising Crew Chief II, Roads
- Laborer to Assistant Maintenance Mason II, Parks and Recreation
- Laborer to Crew Chief, Parks and Recreation
- Park Ranger to Senior Park Ranger, Parks and Recreation
- HVAC Technician to HVAC Mechanic, Facilities
- Laborer to HVAC Technician, Facilities
- Maintenance Electrician to Maintenance Electrician II, Facilities
- Maintenance Painter to Maintenance Painter II, Facilities
- Set Up Mechanic to Building Maintenance Mechanic II, Facilities
- Senior Account Clerk to Principal Account Clerk, Administration

A budgetary transfer will be provided by the Finance Department under separate cover.

Please refer this request to the Personnel committee for their review.

These recommendations have the support of County Executive Byrne. Thank you for your consideration of this request. I, along with Personnel Officer Paul Eldridge, will attend the Personnel Committee meeting on April 13th to answer any questions.

Putnam County Office for Senior Resources requests approval for a restructure of the kitchen staffing in our nutrition program. Staff of the nutrition team are essential to key deliverables and mission of the department.

OSR operates 4 kitchens, one in each of our 4 friendship centers. Our current staffing structure is heavily based on the use of **non"Cook" titled positions** functioning primarily in a cooking role and P/T Food Service Helpers in three of the four nutrition sites Carmel, Putnam Valley, and Philipstown. Our main kitchen at the Koehler Center in Mahopac includes a F/T Cook and 3 P/T Food Service Helpers. Overall kitchen operations are supervised by a F/T Nutrition Services Coordinator/Head Cook. Additionally, given the occurrence of vacancies as well sick, vacation and personal leave, and required staffing levels for kitchen operations, the use of substitutes for each of these positions is also necessary.

Recruiting for staff with sufficient cooking experience has been difficult; furthermore, **Food Service Helpers** job specifications indicate "Work is performed under direct supervision". Recruiting for substitutes has also been challenging.

We are requesting that 3 F/T non "Cook" titled positions (Grade 3) positions be converted to 3 F/T Cook (Grade 5) positions; each site would continue to have a P/T Food Service Helper. Staffing at the main

kitchen in Mahopac would remain same with a F/T Cook and 3 P/T Food Service Helpers as more complex dishes are routinely prepared and distributed to remaining sites from this location. We also request the addition of 1 new position - a F/T Cook as a "floater" to cover absences to reduce our dependency on substitutes. This type of "floater" position has worked well for our bus transportation services where we have a "floater" bus driver.

Functionality at each site will increase, allowing for additional time to be spent deep cleaning, future meal preparation and inventory reconciliation. The **Nutrition Services Coordinator**'s role can resume more supervisory and quality assurance responsibilities, in turn, increasing efficiency and productivity from each kitchen.

Vacancies and absences year to date presents a savings opportunity (\$24,135) in 2023 to offset the annualized (\$4,822) fiscal impact of this restructure. Details as follows.
