October 26, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 6:31pm by Chairman Castellano who requested Legislator Gouldman lead in the Pledge of Allegiance. Upon roll call Legislators Ellner and Gouldman and Chairman Castellano were present.

Item #3 – Acceptance of Minutes – September 21, 2023

The minutes were accepted as submitted.

Item #4 – Correspondence/County Auditor a. Sales Tax Report

Legislator Montgomery requested the amount be read into the record.

Chairman Castellano stated in the month of September the County collected \$9,682,066 in sales tax.

Legislator Montgomery questioned if this amount is \$1,222,597 more than what was projected.

Chairman Castellano stated it is \$1,222,597 higher than what was collected in September 2022.

Legislator Montgomery clarified that the sales tax is projected annually, not monthly.

Chairman Castellano stated that is correct.

- c. Board In Revenue Report

Legislator Gouldman stated this month shows about \$38,000 less than was brought in at this time last year.

Chairman Castellano stated this revenue is collected when non-Putnam residents are housed in our correctional facility. He stated the number of those inmates has decreased recently, which has been addressed in the 2024 budget with lower projections for that revenue.

Legislator Ellner questioned if the County will meet the projected revenue amount for 2023.

Commissioner of Finance Michael Lewis stated there is still another quarter to account for.

Undersheriff Thomas Lindert stated Federal board ins are down, although the Sheriff's Department is in contact with them to let them know space is available. He stated the other jails have become competitive and will lower their daily rate to bring the inmates in.

Legislator Nacerino questioned if bail reform has affected the number of board ins.

Undersheriff Lindert stated mostly the board in inmates are Federal prisoners. He stated Orange County is a big competitor as they are able to lower their price given their size.

Legislator Addonizio questioned if it would be beneficial for Putnam County to lower the price of a daily board in.

Undersheriff Lindert stated he does not believe it would be beneficial to do so because they are mandated to transport inmates to and from court, which could be in Manhattan, Brooklyn, or White Plains. He stated in some cases it could be as far as Albany. He stated they try to board in inmates who would need to be transported more locally, such as White Plains.

Item #5 - Correspondence/ Commissioner of Finance

- b. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A060/ Emergency Services/ FY 2023 State Homeland Security Program (SHSP) Grant Award (No matching funds)

Chairman Castellano made a motion to waive the rules and accept the additional; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Commissioner Lewis stated this is grant is applied for annually and the award is split between the Sheriff's Department and the Bureau of Emergency Services. He stated this year, the Sheriff's Department is receiving 35% and the Bureau of Emergency Services will receive 65%.

Legislator Montgomery thanked Commissioner Lewis for the details included in this Budgetary Amendment.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

c. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A063/ Finance/ Cover Shortfall/ Additional Parcels Acquired that were not included in 2023 Budget

Commissioner Lewis stated these are properties in the foreclosure process and the County is responsible for paying the taxes. He stated surplus from Interest and Earnings is being utilized to offset this cost.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

d. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A064/ Health Dept./ Cover Unforeseen Cost Associated with Preschool Program

Commissioner Lewis stated this cost is being offset by State funding at 57.5%.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

e. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A065/ Finance/ Finance Cost of Purchasing Equipment/ Axon Body Cameras

Commissioner Lewis stated in the 2022 fiscal audit, the auditors considered the purchase of these cameras an installment purchase debt, or a loan. He stated they moved it all to the debt service fund, and this Budgetary Amendment is correcting the 2023 books. He stated this has also been addressed in the 2024 budget. He stated the amortization schedule attached to the budgetary amendment shows the principal and interest for the next few years.

Legislator Montgomery clarified that the body cameras were already purchased and being utilized. She stated she does not believe the policy for the use of these cameras is on the website yet. She stated a Police Policy Review plan was adopted and sent to the State, part of which was to build public trust through transparency.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

Item #6 – Approval/ Fund Transfer 23T312/ DPW/ Properly Allocate to Cover Vacancy

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Item #7 – Approval/ Fund Transfer 23T328/ Purchasing/ Cover Cost of Leased Vehicle due to Miscellaneous Charges

Director of Purchasing John Tully stated this fund transfer properly accounts for the lease expenses that were estimated earlier in the year.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to approve Fund Transfer 23T328; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

Item #8 - Approval/ Fund Transfer 23T341/ Purchasing/ Utilize Surplus Vehicle Leasing Funds for Furniture & Furnishings

Director Tully stated there were departments that submitted 2024 budget requests for furniture and furnishings that were not granted. He stated in addition to that there have been requests made since the budget submissions. He stated he worked with County Executive Byrne to figure out how to help departments in need of new furniture. He stated the excess funds from vehicle leasing were moved into the Purchasing Department and would essentially go unused between now and the end of the year. He stated they believed it would be prudent to transfer a portion of that funding into a furniture and furnishings line to help departments, such as the Probation Department, purchase needed furniture this year.

Chairman Castellano stated a net surplus of \$100,000 will be applied toward furniture purchases for departments.

Commissioner Lewis stated it may be more prudent to put this funding into a Capital Project rather than an operating transfer.

Director Tully stated at the time this was presented, they met with the State contractor who has the award for furniture and furnishings who pointed out that timing might be a concern because purchases and deliveries would be made late in the year and can be impacted by the holidays or by supply chain issues that would push purchase and delivery into next year. He stated County Auditor Michele Sharkey and Commissioner Lewis suggested putting this funding into a Capital Project line and the funding would be available in 2024.

Legislator Nacerino stated her support for putting this money into a Capital Project to avoid potential issues as we near the end of the year.

Commissioner Lewis stated it also avoids issues with the auditors, who will question purchase orders without valid commitments.

Legislator Nacerino stated when the Probation Department spoke to their need for furniture she was concerned that their original request in the 2024 budget was reduced. She stated every employee should have a good working environment. She stated she is happy to see this being done now and doing it as a Capital Project is appropriate.

Director Tully stated it also allows them to get a jump start on it, aggregate the purchases, and get a volume discount.

Legislator Crowley questioned if any of the surplus funds were from the County's inability to lease vehicles due to unavailability.

Director Tully stated no, 100% of the surplus was as a result of leasing vehicles rather than purchasing them.

Legislator Addonizio stated she was also concerned about the Probation Department, and she is happy to see that they will be getting the furniture they need.

Legislator Sayegh requested clarification on this funding and how it relates to the 2024 budget requests made by departments.

Director Tully stated the funding being used is what the County saved by leasing vehicles rather than purchasing them. She stated when departments submitted requests for furniture in their 2024 budget to the County Executive, many of those requests were reduced with the intent to find funding to take care of their immediate needs. He stated funds will be utilized from the 2023 budget as well as the 2024 budget.

Legislator Sayegh clarified that of the \$100,000 being discussed this evening, about \$40,000 will be going to the Probation Department.

Director Tully stated approximately yes, they are still waiting on the estimates from the State contractor. He stated there could be another \$30,000 identified this year as well. He stated while the expert was here, they walked through various departments to identify furniture needs. He stated for example, the chairs in the Legislative Meeting room are not the proper chairs; they could be replaced and repurposed to another department. He stated the 911 Dispatch Center is also in need of new chairs, which are used 24/7.

County Auditor Michele Sharkey stated if the Committee agrees to put this funding into a Capital Project this fund transfer will need to be revised.

Legislative Clerk Diane Schonfeld stated a separate resolution for the Capital Project will be required as well.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to approve in concept the resolution establishing the capital project; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Item #9 – Approval/ Fund Transfer 23T343/ Health Dept./ Cover Unforeseen Costs Associated with Preschool Program

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Item #10 – Approval/ Proposed Resolution/ Providing an Exemption from Sales Tax for Certain Clothing and Footwear

Chairman Castellano made a motion to waive the rules and accept the additional; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

Commissioner Lewis stated this initiative was brought forward by County Executive Byrne in his 2024 Budget presentation. He stated this is an amendment to the resolution that will provide an exemption from sales tax for certain clothing and footwear purchases under \$110. He stated the amendment was the addition of a sunset clause stating this will run March 1, 2024-March 1, 2025. He stated this is more of a pilot program. He stated based on the data received from the NYS Department of Taxation and Finance, this could result in about a \$3 million loss of revenue for the County.

Chairman Castellano stated the savings to the taxpayer would be the 4% sales tax that would otherwise go to the County. He stated the addition of the sunset clause is a great idea as it will be revisited and considered each year.

Legislator Ellner stated this will need to be reviewed in September of each year to allow for the 90 day time frame before the beginning of the year. He stated therefore, this will again be in front of the Legislature this September, although there may not be enough data since it will not go into effect until March 1st. He suggested extending the sunset to March 1, 2026 to allow for a full year of data before reconsidering this, especially to include the holiday season and back to school shopping.

Legislative Gouldman supported amending the sunset to March 1, 2026, allowing more time for sales tax data to be recognized.

Legislator Crowley stated her support of extending the sunset.

Chairman Castellano requested clarification on if the Committee is able to amend the sunset clause to a two (2) year period.

Deputy County Executive James Burpoe stated it can be set at two (2) years as long as it runs from March to March.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to amend the resolution to expire March 1, 2026; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Legislator Gouldman made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Item #11 - Approval/ Appointment/ Commissioner of Planning/ Barosa

County Executive Kevin Byrne thanked Chairman Castellano for including this on the agenda this evening as an appointment would usually go to the Personnel Committee Meeting. He stated the Commissioner of Planning position has been vacant for quite a long time. He stated Barbra Barosa has been working in the Planning Department for 10 years and has an extensive background in planning. He stated there were qualified candidates, and Barbara rose to the top of the list.

Interim Commissioner of Planning Barbara Barosa stated she is honored to have been selected to fill the Commissioner of Planning position.

Legislator Montgomery stated she is thrilled to have a Certified Planner in this position. She thanked Interim Commissioner Barosa for her work with the towns and villages.

Director Tully thanked the Legislature in advance for their support of Barbara Barosa's appointment to Commissioner. He stated a lot of the work done by Barbara over the past 10 years has come before the Legislature, although her name may not have been on it. He stated Barbara has been diligent in many of the grant applications and other vital correspondence that has come out of the Planning Department. He stated with the impeccable work being done by Barbara in the Planning Department, his job has been made easier.

Legislator Nacerino stated she is very pleased with this appointment and she is happy to have Barbara Barosa filling this position. She recognized how hard Barbara has worked on all the vital projects over the years.

Legislator Sayegh stated her support for this appointment. She stated as a member of the Soil & Water Conservation Board she has spent some time over in the Planning Department and believes Barbara Barosa is more than competent to fill this position.

Legislator Addonizio echoed the sentiments of her colleagues and congratulated Interim Commissioner Barosa.

Legislator Crowley stated unfortunately she will not be at the November 8, 2023 Full Legislative Meeting to vote on this, but wanted to state her support. She stated the calmness and strength Interim Commissioner Barosa brings to a meeting is a unique characteristic.

Chairman Castellano stated Interim Commissioner Barosa's resume is outstanding and he thanked her for all the work she has done and will do for Putnam County.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

Item #12 – Approval/ Semi-Annual Mortgage Tax Payments/ April 1, 2023-September 30, 2023

Chairman Castellano stated the County Clerk's Office receives the mortgage tax on any mortgage filed in Putnam County and it is then distributed to the local municipalities. He stated the numbers are much lower than they have been in recent years. He read the amount each town and village will be receiving:

- Town of Carmel \$375,095.30
- Town of Kent \$191,155.25
- Town of Patterson \$151,591.54
- Town of Philipstown \$49,445.94
- Village of Cold Spring \$12,439.39
- Village of Nelsonville \$3,510.63
- Town of Putnam Valley \$148,974.20
- Town of Southeast \$226,353,74
- Village of Brewster \$7,001.09

He stated the total amount is \$1,265,567.08. He stated this is done every six (6) months.

Legislator Sayegh stated she recently spoke to a Town Councilmember and they were not aware that the County does not take a portion of this mortgage tax. She clarified that all of the mortgage tax the County processes goes directly back to the local municipalities.

Chairman Castellano stated this is a shared service, County employees are doing the work to collect the money and then sending it right to the towns and villages. He states looking back at the same time period last year, the County distributed \$1 million more than this year.

Commissioner Lewis stated the high interest rates are deterring people from refinancing or taking out a mortgage.

Legislator Addonizio stated the inventory is also low right now.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Item #13 – FYI/ County's Deposit & Investment Policies for the 3rd Quarter Ending September 30, 2023

Commissioner Lewis stated with high interest rates come high interest earnings, which the County has been able to take advantage of. He provided an overview of the County's investments. He stated the financial consultant the County works with recommended

revising the County's investment policy to provide more flexibility to invest more. He stated he will come back before the committee with recommended amendments to that policy.

Legislator Ellner questioned the wide range of interest rates.

Commissioner Lewis stated any surplus monies the County gets goes right into an investment pool, all of which are supported by NYSAC (New York State Association of Counties).

Legislator Gouldman stated the public should be very happy with how our Finance Department handles their money. He provided the example of last year when there was a banking crisis; the County Finance Department moved very quickly to ensure the taxpayer's money was protected.

Item #14 – Other Business

a. Approval/ Fund Transfer 23T349/ Sheriff/ Purchase Air Ventilation System

Chairman Castellano made a motion to waive the rules and accept the other business; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

Chairman Castellano stated a letter of necessity was sent requesting this be considered so the air ventilation system could be purchased at the best possible price.

Undersheriff Thomas Lindert stated the air ventilation system is for the evidence lab. He stated this is part of a grant and was priced out when the grant was written. He stated the grant came through and the money is available, however the price has increased. He stated this money is being transferred within the grant to cover the increased cost.

Legislator Montgomery stated she is glad to see these improvements being made to County facilities, especially coming out of the COVID pandemic.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to approve Fund Transfer 23T349; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Item #15 – Adjournment

There being no further business at 7:21pm, Chairman Castellano made a motion to adjourn; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

The meeting was called to order at 6:30pm by Chairman Castellano who requested Legislator Gouldman lead in the Pledge of Allegiance. Upon roll call Legislators Ellner and Gouldman and Chairman Castellano were present.

Item #3 – Acceptance of Minutes – October 12, 2023 Budget Mtg.

The minutes were accepted as submitted.

Item #5 – Discussion/ Request to Edit Budgetary Amendment & Fund Transfer Forms

Chairman Castellano made a motion to waive the rules and accept the additional; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Commissioner of Finance Michael Lewis stated he worked with County Auditor Michael Sharkey to find the best report to provide. He stated they were able to find a decent report, however there is no option to print when viewing the report. He stated the provided example relates to item #7 on this evening's agenda, Fund Transfer 23T352. He stated it is his understanding that the requested information relates more to Budgetary Transfers and Fund Transfers than to Budgetary Amendments. He stated a Budgetary Amendment has an offsetting appropriation with revenue or vice versa. He referred to the example fund transfer and stated it is transferring funds for chargeback gasoline from one account to another. He stated this type of transfer is done with the analysis of the Fiscal Manager in the department. He stated the report provided shows the original and revised accounts. He stated there are some accounts that are fluid such as vendor accounts from where payments are made on a regular basis. He stated in order to have the most up to date data, the report would have to be run right before the Committee Meeting where the fund transfer is being reviewed. He stated the report itself is very cumbersome and can only be printed by screenshotting the page. He stated this specific fund transfer had eight budget lines on it, necessitating 8 reports to be run, screenshotted, and printed.

Legislator Ellner stated when he brought this idea forward he was hoping it would not be cumbersome on the Finance Department. He stated if the software is incapable of generating and printing the report easily, it may be more trouble than it is worth.

Commissioner Lewis stated each fund transfer and budgetary amendment goes through a workflow, which provides safeguards. He stated a department cannot just move funds between accounts without going through the proper process.

Legislator Ellner stated his intention was less about a concern over safeguards and more an interest in having more information when making a decision.

Commissioner Lewis stated if a Legislator had a question about a specific account a report could be run at that point.

Chairman Castellano stated the Finance Department and Audit Department are always accessible to answer questions. He stated generating these reports for every fund transfer would be too cumbersome.

- b. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A066/ Dept. of Social Services/ Contract Renewal to Child Advocacy Center/ Other than Personnel Costs (Also reviewed in Health)

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

c. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A068/ Putnam County Golf Course/ Operational Funding through Year End (Also reviewed in Physical)

Commissioner Lewis stated this is recognizing the year-to-date surplus revenues and adjusting the budget accordingly.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

 d. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A069/ Health Dept./ Use of Adolescent Tobacco Use Prevention Act (ATUPA) Fines (Also reviewed in Health)

Commissioner Lewis stated surplus revenues are being recognized and utilized to fund supplies, materials, and miscellaneous items related to this program.

Chairman Castellano stated this is not taxpayer money; it is fines collected from violations.

Legislator Sayegh stated these ATUPA funds are increasing due to the rampant violations being found in Putnam County. She stated a great place to spend the money collected from these fines is to educate children and teenagers about the negative side effects of tobacco use.

Chairman Castellano questioned how the fines are collected.

Commissioner Lewis stated the Health Department collects the fines.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

e. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A070/ DPW/ Additional Funding to Respond to Flood Damage from July Storm (Also reviewed in Physical)

Chairman Castellano stated this money should be reimbursed by FEMA.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

f. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A071/ Sheriff/ Dept. of Social Services/ Use Awarded Funds for Full Time Mental Health Clinician as part of Police & Mental Health Co-Response Team (Also reviewed in Personnel)

Commissioner Lewis stated this is a \$400,000 grant the County was able to obtain. He stated this is year 1 of this budgetary amendment, some costs are prorated between year 1 and year 2 and there are some implementation costs that effect year 1.

Legislator Crowley thanked Commissioner of DSS Sara Servadio and Sheriff Kevin McConville for their work on this. She stated this will have a such a positive impact on our community.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

g. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A073/ Health Dept./ Optimize Adolescent Tobacco Use Prevention Act Grant by Increasing Compliance Checks on Sale of Vaping & Tobacco Products to Minors

Commissioner Lewis stated this budgetary amendment is for the State grant portion of the ATUPA funds.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

h. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A076/ Dept. of Social Services/ Utilize Opioid Settlement Trust Monies to Fund Evidence Based Programs and Strategies

Commissioner Lewis stated there are \$720,000 of opioid settlement monies to be distributed, there was an RFP process and there was a Committee who vetted the applications. He stated based on those recommendations, money will be allocated to organizations working to eradicate opioid abuse.

Legislator Sayegh stated she was on the Committee, they reviewed and scored each application, however they did not participate in how much would be allocated to each organization. He stated the programs were to focus on co-occurring disorders; mental health issues paired with opioid abuse.

Legislator Addonizio stated the County will continue to receive payments from the opioid settlement and questioned what the total amount the County will be receiving is.

Commissioner Lewis stated payments will be made to the County through 2039. He stated he does not have the exact number, but it will be a few million dollars. He stated he received a notification today that the amount distributed by the LGU (Local Government Unit) is going to be \$450,000 for 2024. He stated he is currently working on a schedule that he will provide to the Committee.

Legislator Sayegh requested clarification on where the money is coming from, as she believes there is two (2) pots of funds.

Commissioner Lewis stated money is coming from the opioid settlement and the LGU abatement funds.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

i. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A077/ Planning Dept./ Distribution of NY & CT CRRSAA (Coronavirus Response & Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act) and NY & CT ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) from NYMTC (New York Metropolitan Transportation Council regarding Federal Transit Funding for FFY 2023

Commissioner Lewis stated he has worked with the Commissioner of Planning Barbara Barosa to correct the books and recognize these buckets of money. He stated this one in particular was a resolution from NYMTC for the fiscal year 2023. He stated this adjusts that budget to be used for future projects.

Commissioner of Planning Barbara Barosa stated this is specific to transit. She stated NYMTC is essentially the transportation planning organization for this metropolitan area.

She stated they distribute all the money from the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) and this budgetary amendment is allocating the relief money Putnam County received. She stated the funding is geared toward operations and maintenance of the transit facility and will replace the utilization of tax dollars for this purpose.

Legislator Ellner questioned why the attached backup material references a resolution from 2018.

Commissioner Barosa stated the MTA (Metropolitan Transit Authority) and the listed counties reached an agreement in 2018 on the percentage of the share of the overall amount that comes to this area. He stated at that time, it was agreed upon that Putnam County would receive 0.2%. She stated this is based on population and the size of the transportation fleet.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

j. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A078/ County Attorney/ Cover Legal Services through Year End/ Litigation Settlement/ Haughey v. County of Putnam

Legislator Ellner questioned if the litigation settlement would be considered separately.

Commissioner Lewis stated one (1) budgetary was created for both legal services and the litigation settlement.

Eric Gross, Reporter, questioned if Chairman Castellano is at liberty to speak about the litigation settlement.

Chairman Castellano stated the settlement has not yet been approved by the Full Legislature; it will be considered at the December 5, 2023 Full Legislative Meeting.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

k. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A080/ Planning Dept./ Utilize CRRSAA & ARPA Funds to Purchase & Install Automatic Passenger Counter on Transit Vehicles

Commissioner Barosa stated currently, passengers are manually counted by the bus drivers who write down the data and then someone in the office tabulates it into a spreadsheet daily. She stated they are required to report on the number of passengers to the State and Federal Government. She stated these counters will make it much easier.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

I. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A081/ Planning Dept./ Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Grant Award of \$1,602,090/ Maybrook Bikeway II Phase/ Rolling Stock Purchases of 2 Hybrid Bus Trolleys, Transit Bus, 4 Passenger Vans & Project Administration

Commissioner Barosa stated they applied for this grant in May. She stated the County received the grant and this budgetary amendment creates budget lines for the funding.

Chairman Castellano questioned what Maybrook Bikeway II Phase includes.

Commissioner Barosa stated it is the missing piece of Bridge 5 in Brewster.

Chairman Castellano stated he believed that bridge was owned by the MTA.

Commissioner Barosa stated it is, however Putnam County has a 100 year lease with MTA for the bridge. She stated because the County is building the bikeway, we are responsible for correcting the deficiencies in the construction.

Chairman Castellano stated it is a beautiful old bridge and it will be a great addition to the bike path.

Commissioner Barosa stated it is fully designed and they are close to going to bid.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

m. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A082/ Planning Dept./ Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Grant Award of \$750,000/ Maybrook Bikeway II Phase A & Project Administration

He stated utilizing a mounted LPR will provide this information and can aid in criminal investigations. He stated these will be deployed regularly throughout the County at "hot spots".

Legislator Crowley questioned if this will replace a deputy having to monitor an area in response to complaints of speed.

Sheriff McConville stated an officer will still respond to any call that comes in. He stated better information including time, speed, and specific offenses will be provided. He stated instead of having a deputy in the area for eight (8) hours, this technology will provide the analysis and data which will then be used for enforcement.

Legislator Crowley thanked Sheriff McConville. She stated it is a better use of the deputies' time.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to approve Fund Transfer 23T421; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

There being no further business at 7:09pm, Chairman Castellano made a motion to adjourn; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

WHEREAS, the New York Metropolitan Transportation Council (NYMTC) is a regional council of governments which is the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for New York City, suburban Long Island and the lower Hudson Valley; and

WHEREAS, federal transit funding is allocated to urbanized areas (UZAs) throughout the country; and

WHEREAS, NYMTC's planning area includes a large portion of New York-Newark NY-NJ-CT UZA (UACE 63217) and small portions of the Bridgeport-Stamford CT-NY-UZA (UACE 10162) and Danbury CT UZA (UACE 22096); and

WHEREAS, these UZAs also encompass areas in the states of New Jersey and Connecticut; and

WHEREAS, the states of New York, New Jersey, and Connecticut have agreed to suballocate FFY 2023 funds appropriated by Congress and apportioned to the areas of these UZAs within their boundaries; and

WHEREAS, NYMTC desires to make these suballocated funds available to the designated recipients of federal transit funding in its planning area in a timely manner consistent with the requirements of federal authorizing legislation; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) will make the full amount of these suballocated funds available for obligation; and

WHEREAS, the designated recipients of federal transit funds in NYMTC's planning area agree to the distribution of these suballocated funds, using negotiated shares, as outlined in the attached table; and

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) and the New York City Department of Transportation (NYCDOT), who are both designated recipients, have agreed on the portion of these fund sources distributed to NYCDOT that will be transferred to the MTA with the understanding that these funds or equivalent funds will be used for the MTA Bus capital program as per MTA's agreement with New York City to operate bus service in areas previously served by private bus companies under expired franchise agreements; and

WHEREAS, MTA and NYCDOT have agreed to the amount to be transferred and, to notify the FTA by letter or email of the agreed upon amount that will be transferred to the MTA; and

WHEREAS, this pending letter should not impede the ability of the other designated recipients within the NYMTC planning area to apply for their funds; and

WHEREAS, the final allocation of Section 5307/5340 Urbanized Area funds, Section 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities funds, and Section 5337 High Intensity Motorbus funds in NYMTC's planning area is shown in the "Adjusted Total Distribution" column in the attached table.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that PFAC agrees to distribute the suballocations of the FFY 2023 Section 5307/5340 funds, Section 5337 funds and Section 5339 funds as specified in the attachment to this resolution.

This resolution shall take effect the fifteenth day of May, two thousand and twenty-three.

Nursing Overtime: Currently have positive Tuberculosis caseload of a family of five that requires "Direct Observed Therapy" (DOT), which requires two Nurses go to the home every day, including weekends and Holidays, to aid the family prepare and take the appropriate medications for their treatment plans. This is a mandated service to ensure Tuberculosis patients are taking the medications as prescribed, to avoid spreading this highly communicable disease.

Adolescent Tobacco Use Prevention Act (ATUPA) Overtime: Due to large demand for Vaping products, ATUPA staff have been conducting more compliance checks than expected, and in certain cases, follow-up compliance checks are required on vendors who have sales violations (selling to underage persons).

Rabies – Vaccine purchase- Funding this line in the event of additional exposure through end of 2023. There is currently no funding available in this line; if there is a possible Rabies exposure case, funding needs to be available for emergency vaccine purchase.

EHS Overtime: Many more phone calls, as regards to Rabies, during non-working hours. More outside food events in 2023, which our staff attends, to monitor food quality.

Lead Machine Maintenance: Repair XRF Lead testing machine. Machine malfunctioned on the last Lead testing case. Staff contacted vendor and have received a quote to ship and repair the machine. NYS mandates to test for Lead in the home of all new and ongoing positive Lead cases. We have several new cases that will require immediate testing.

Nursing Computer Equipment: Replace three old/slow computers and purchase one additional monitor. Monitor is for set up of double screens for use of new Electronic Medical Record software (Patagonia) Please see approved quote attached. Approved by IT Department.

Contingency: Remaining funds used to increase Contingency account.

As a result of grant funding, the Health Department requested the creation of a new position earlier this year. The position was titled Quality Improvement/Performance Management Coordinator and was funded on a part-time basis earlier this year. Due to recruitment difficulties, The Health Department is currently requesting that this position be funded full time beginning on January 1, 2024. Additionally, the job specification and title were reviewed and updated, and the job was retitled to Quality Improvement/Program Evaluation Manager. Please refer to this position with its updated title moving forward.

Furthermore, the salary is indicated as a Grade 21. Please note that this is not allocating the title to CSEA, rather, it is being used as a salary indicator for recruitment purposes.

In June 2023, Putnam County Department of Health presented to the personnel committee, a proposed budget related to an award from NYSDOH for the purpose of strengthening the workforce and foundational capabilities of the county public health department. The current grant period for this funding (\$692,296) is 12/1/2022-11/30/2027. NYSDOH has notified all local health departments to budget the entire allocated award, despite the 12/1/2022 start date.

Previously, PCDOH had budgeted for a full-time Public Health Data and Informatics Specialist and a part-time Quality Improvement/Performance Management (QIPM) Coordinator. PCDOH is requesting a modification to support expanding the QIPM position from part-time to full-time. If the two grant-funded positions are filled in early January, PCDOH has established a budget to support both positions as full-time through 8/31/2026. The PCDOH interview team has reevaluated the needs and determined that despite the impact on the length of time the funding will last, it is most important at this time to be able to recruit skilled full-time staff.

The work of a QIPM Coordinator intersects with every aspect of the ten essential public health services—from community and program assessment to policy review and development and everything in between. Additionally, as applicants have begun to reply to the job postings it has become clear that qualified applicants with experience in quality improvement and program evaluation have passed on the opportunity to apply for the part-time position, instead applying for the full-time Data and Informatics role.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS: This position involves the performance of difficult clerical and secretarial tasks which may require operation of such equipment as a personal computer or word-processor. SENIOR CASEWORKER

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS: The senior caseworker provides professional casework and social work services, involving investigation and resolution of difficult problem cases as well as determination and recommendation of needs for services. The senior caseworker is also responsible for the development and implementation of plans to resolve problems and/or meet the individual needs of assigned cases. Additionally, the senior caseworker may be assigned to provide supervision of one or more programs in the Department of Social Services. Work is performed under general supervision, and direct supervision is provided over the activities of caseworkers and clerical employees. Performs related work as required.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES: (Illustrative only)

- Interviews applicants and persons referring cases of children needing care, supervision, or services; recommends services necessary to carry out plans to meet the needs of individuals or families;
- Makes visits to applicants to ascertain the need for services;
- Develops involved or complex social histories and a plan of treatment which, with supervisory approval, is the basis for delivery of the services;
- Aids individual caseworkers in formulating service and work organization plans;
- In each case, in cooperation with the individual or family plans the use to be made of available resources;
- Studies the background and need for care of children referred, securing information from the child himself, the family, relatives, schools, churches, family courts and other agencies;
- Makes necessary collateral contacts with employees, relatives, friends, physicians, hospitals, and other agencies;
- When foster care is necessary, determines whether the child's needs can best be met in an institution or foster family home;
- Finds family homes interested in caring for children;
- Studies and evaluates family homes desiring to care for children at board, at wages, or on a free or adoptive basis and recommends boarding homes for certification;
- Arranges for medical care of children in foster homes, takes children to doctors, dentists, and clinics if foster parents are unable to do so;
- Plans with parents and relatives for the care of children and re-establishment of the home;
- · Makes referrals to other agencies when indicated;
- · Writes letters and reports as required;
- Periodically reviews cases to determine changes in client situation affecting the need for service;
- · Assists the case supervisor in administering the work of the unit;
- · Performs a variety of related activities as required.

Typical Work Activities are intended only as illustrations of possible types of work that might be appropriately assigned to an incumbent of this title. Work activities that do not appear above are not excluded as appropriate work assignments, as long as they can be reasonably understood to be within the logical limits of the job.
