The meeting was called to order at 7:00 P.M. by Chairman Jonke who requested Legislator Sayegh lead in the Pledge of Allegiance and Legislator Ellner lead in the Legislative Prayer. Upon roll call, Legislators Montgomery, Gouldman, Ellner, Castellano, Sayegh, Crowley and Chairman Jonke were present. Legislators Addonizio and Nacerino were absent. Also present was Legislative Counsel Firriolo.

PROCLAMATIONS

Chairman Jonke recognized Legislator Ellner who presented the following proclamation honoring the Mahopac Putnam Valley Carmel Varsity Girls Swim Team.

HONORING THE MAHOPAC PUTNAM VALLEY CARMEL VARSITY GIRLS SWIM TEAM

WHEREAS, the hard work, dedication, talent, and exceptional team chemistry of the Mahopac Putnam Valley Carmel Varsity Girls Swim Team led them to secure the 2023 League Championship after an undefeated season for the second year in a row; and

WHEREAS, the co-op Team expanded to a third school district as they entered the 2023 season with the addition of 9 Carmel High School swimmers. The team's success in the previous year presented them with a new challenge as they were moved up from League 4 to League 3, placing them among stronger teams. Determined to have another successful season, each swimmer brought their all to every single event, overcoming illnesses and injuries along the way. HONORING CHIEF ROBERT BODDIE AND CHIEF JEFFERY PHILLIPS

WHEREAS, on the morning of January 15, 2024 the Continental Village Volunteer Fire Department was dispatched to a structure fire at 56 Roa Hook Road in the town of Cortlandt; and

WHEREAS, Chief of the Continental Village Volunteer Fire Department Robert Boddie and Chief of the Cold Spring Volunteer Fire Department Jeffery Phillips arrived on the scene within two minutes of receiving the call. Upon their arrival, residents injured in the fire who had narrowly escaped, informed Chief Boddie and Chief Phillips that their family members were still inside of the burning building. The two Chiefs immediately sprang into action, entering the burning building and began their search, knowing there was not enough time to wait for the first Fire Engine bringing water and additional personnel to arrive; and

WHEREAS, once inside the building the two Chiefs encountered a dangerous environment of low visibility and rising heat. With the conditions rapidly deteriorating, they knew their mission of finding the remaining individuals was becoming even more paramount as potential survival waned and the fire became more powerful. Relying on their training and immense courage, Chief Boddie and Chief Phillips located the two individuals, an adult and child, inside the building and got them to safety; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Putnam County Executive and the Putnam County Legislature do hereby recognize Chief of the Continental Village Volunteer Fire Department Robert Boddie and Chief of the Cold Spring Volunteer Fire Department Jeffery Phillips for their instinctive calling to help those in need and their swift actions on January 15, 2024 that resulted in the survival of all residents of 56 Roa Hook Road. Legislator Castellano explained that this was a revised resolution for the resolution previously approved.

Legislator Montgomery stated that she has struggled with this. She stated that the project has gone through a vigorous approval process through the Planning Board. She stated that the Brewster School District has not approved this yet. She explained that the PILOT agreement is tax payment at a reduced rate over time for this project. She stated that it did not have the full support of the IDA. She stated that for a project like this with the visual impact on the community and now we are giving them a tax break, does not feel right to her. She stated that she would not be supporting this resolution.

Legislator Ellner clarified that it was his understanding that this modifies a provisional agreement which was a tax break originally for 12 years and reduces that to only 10 years. She stated that the agreement also separates both structures so in essence if the owner chooses to sell a structure, they could now do so without voiding the agreement.

Legislator Sayegh stated that Chairwoman of the Rules Committee, Legislator Addonizio asked her to read a statement on her behalf. In Legislator Addonizio's statement she explained that, as Chairwoman of the Rules Committee, she has been advocating for compliance with the IDA Labor Policy. She recognized the advantage of the newly proposed PILOT and wanted to express her appreciation and applaud the IDA and the board members for their commitment to enforcing the Labor Policy. She understood that some IDA Board members voted against the PILOT Agreement, presumably because Brewster Industrial owners were focused on building one million square feet for

speculation. She stated that she was also not in favor of granting PILOTS for projects built from speculation. She also stated that she was hoping the Labor Policy would be enforced in the future in order to create local jobs in the Hudson Valley.

Legislator Crowley believed that we needed to provide the IDA with more resources to enforce the Labor Law to be able to have identification to go on the job sites and be more active in the role they play.

Legislator Montgomery spoke to the Chairman's point during the Committee meeting about giving the IDA the appropriate resources, however, she believed that we were not there yet. She questioned how the labor policies were going to be enforced. She stated that it is a challenge right now to get the information we need moving forward with this project. She was in favor of more support for the IDA, but believed this was not the time to approve this PILOT.

Legislator Sayegh stated that the IDA does an incredible job of inviting businesses to Putnam County. She stated that development in Putnam County brings in tax dollars. She stated that although they are receiving a 10-year tax break by paying reduced taxes, they are still paying taxes in Putnam County and will continue to pay taxes in Putnam County. She believed Putnam County needed to be open for business to reduce the tax burden on Putnam County homeowners.

Chairman Jonke concurred. He stated that he spent 35 years of his life in a career dealing with property taxes. He stated that we really do need a balance of commercial and residential. He stated that this project will bring in a lot of tax dollars to a school district without the school district having to provide a service to this property. He commended IDA Chairman Bill Nulk for adopting policies, however, the County did not give him the support to enforce those policies. As he stated during the Committee meeting, this is something we need to address moving forward. He stated that this project is in his Legislative District, the Southeast Town Board does support it, and the school district is waiting for the County to approve this and they would then approve it within the next 30 days.

APPROVAL / BREWSTER INDUSTRIAL OWNER, LLC PROJECT / PAYMENT IN LIEU OF TAXES (PILOT) AGREEMENT (REVISED) / INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY (IDA)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution #169 of 2023, the Putnam County Legislature authorized and approved a twelve-year real property tax abatement schedule and payment in lieu of taxes ("PILOT") agreement in connection with certain improvements to be operated as a distribution center on property situated at 101 and 201 Pugsley Road, Brewster, New York 10509, further described as Section 45, Block 1, Lot 5, and Section 45, Block 1, Lot 8.2 on the Official Tax Map of the Town of Southeast (collectively, the "Subject Premises"); and

WHEREAS, the project is being done with the financial assistance of the Putnam County Industrial Agency ("IDA"); and

WHEREAS, project owner Brewster Industrial Owner, LLC, has requested a revised property tax abatement schedule of ten (10) years, which will now align with

the ten-year benefit schedule outlined in NY Real Property Tax Law Section 485-B; and

WHEREAS, the Audit and Administration Committee of the Putnam County Legislature has reviewed the project owner's request and its proposed, revised schedule of property tax payments for each parcel (attached hereto), as well as the additional information provided by the IDA regarding the request and the status of the project; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Putnam County Legislature hereby authorizes and approves the following revised tax abatement schedule to be applied only to so much of the assessed valuation of the Subject Premises applicable solely to the improvements made pursuant to the IDA benefits package contemplated hereunder:

Item #7 - Other Business

Item #7a - Approval/ Litigation Settlement/ TD Auto Finance LLC v. County of Putnam was next.

Chairman Jonke made a motion to add other business Item #7a to the agenda; seconded by Legislator Sayegh. All in favor.

RESOLUTION #49

APPROVAL/ LITIGATION SETTLEMENT/ TD AUTO FINANCE LLC V. COUNTY OF PUTNAM

WHEREAS, on or about November 4, 2021, Plaintiff TD Auto Finance LLC (Plaintiff) commenced action against the County of Putnam in United States District Court, Southern District of New York alleging Section 1983 civil rights violations, specifically that the County's practice and custom in civil forfeiture matters did not provide Plaintiff with due process of law as Plaintiff was not timely notified of the seizure of the subject vehicle and

not provided with an opportunity to be heard at any point in connection with the seizure; and

WHEREAS, Plaintiff sought recovery for financial damages in an undetermined amount as well as costs, disbursements, attorney's fees and interest; and

WHEREAS, the County's insurer, NYMIR, assigned the Portale Randazzo law firm, James A. Randazzo, Esq., to defend the County's interests in this matter, which litigation has been handled by counsel since action was commenced; and

WHEREAS, following extensive motion practice the Court granted Plaintiff's motion for summary judgment determining in doing so that the County violated Plaintiff's procedural due process rights under the Fourteenth Amendment concerning the County's handling of the subject impounded vehicle; and

WHEREAS, Plaintiff proposed for consideration a settlement with the County subject to the County Attorney's endorsement and Legislature's approval, in which the County, would pay Plaintiff, inclusive of attorneys' fees and costs, the sum of one hundred fifteen thousand two hundred sixty six dollars and forty five cents (\$115,266.45); and

WHEREAS, in response to Plaintiff's settlement demand of \$115,266.45, outside counsel, negotiated a reduced settlement of one hundred two thousand five hundred dollars (\$102,500.00); and

WHEREAS, the County Attorney, the County's outside counsel, James A. Randazzo, Esq., and NYMIR's claims representative conditionally recommended settlement as an alternative to proceeding with an appeal that outside counsel does not believe will be successful; and

WHEREAS, the County Attorney and the County's outside counsel, now present this updated settlement to the Legislature and approve the proposed settlement as an alternative to appeal so as to minimize the County's exposure and risk potential for an increased amount; and

WHEREAS, the proposed settlement is in the public interest and would avoid the costs of further litigation, additional attorney's fees and costs and the risk of an appeal; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the proposed settlement of this matter for the sum of one hundred two thousand five hundred dollars (\$102,500.00) is hereby approved.

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is hereby authorized to sign any required settlement documents on behalf of the County including a Settlement Agreement and General Release with respect thereto.

BY POLL VOTE: ALL AYES. LEGISLATORS ADDONIZIO & NACERINO WERE ABSENT. MOTION CARRIES.

Item #7b – Confirmation/ Designation of Jail Chief Medical Officer (Tabled from Organizational Meeting) **was next.**

Chairman Jonke made a motion to add Item #7b to the agenda; seconded by Legislator Crowley. All in favor.

Chairman Jonke stated that this item was tabled at the Organizational meeting. He stated that we were waiting for confirmation from the contractor, PrimeCare, of their designation of the Jail Physician.

RESOLUTION #50

DESIGNATION OFJAIL CHIEF MEDICAL OFFICER

WHEREAS, due to a change in the Corrections Law, Section 501 in July of 2017, a physician from the medical services provider to the Putnam County Jail shall be designated by the Putnam County Legislature to act as the Chief Medical Officer of the Jail; and

WHEREAS, PrimeCare was awarded the RFP to provide medical services for the Putnam County Corrections Facility initially through December 31, 2021; and

WHEREAS, as stated in Resolution #48 of 2023, Putnam County exercised the contractual option to extend Prime Care's contract under the terms of the RFP response through December 31, 2023; and

WHEREAS, Putnam County has exercised the contractual option to extend Prime Care's contract under the terms of the RFP response through December 31, 2024; and

WHEREAS, PrimeCare has proposed Dr. Michael Nesheiwat to act as the Chief Medical Officer for the Jail: now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Putnam County Legislature hereby designates Dr. Michael Nesheiwat to act as the Chief Medical Officer for the Putnam County Corrections Facility, for a period of one (1) year, said term to expire December 31, 2024.

BY POLL VOTE: ALL AYES. LEGISLATORS ADDONIZIO & NACERINO WERE ABSENT. MOTION CARRIES.

Item #7c – Approval/Appointment/ Budget & Finance Committee Representative / Capital Projects Committee (Tabled from Organizational Meeting) was next.

Chairman Jonke made a motion to add Item #7c to the agenda; seconded by Legislator Sayegh. All in favor.

Legislator Montgomery explained that this will be the fourth Committee that Legislator Ellner will be appointed to, and she too serves on this Capital Projects Committee, per the Charter, which meets once a year. She stated that her fellow Legislators are appointed to serve on two (2) or three (3) Committees, and she does not serve on any.

Legislator Montgomery made a motion to remove Legislator Ellner from the Rules Committee before he is appointed to the Capital Projects Committee.

There was no second. Motion failed.

Legislator Montgomery stated that she serves this County well. She explained that many items she has put forward to a Committee sometimes do not receive a second, and certainly do not get approved. However, these items eventually become policy like the Complete Streets Policy approved last month, which she proposed one year ago but it was turned down. She stated that someone else proposed it one month ago and it was approved. She also suggested receiving a resume before appointing individuals to serve on our Boards and it was never enforced. She stated that when someone else brought it up, it became the policy. She explained that she paved the way for the Climate Smart Initiative and sales tax sharing with the towns.

RESOLUTION #51

APPOINTMENT/ BUDGET & FINANCE COMMITTEE REPRESENTATIVE/ CAPITAL PROJECTS COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, County Charter § 7.05 (B)(3) provides that there shall be a Capital Projects Committee consisting of various members including a designee of the Budget and Finance Committee; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that Greg Ellner be appointed as Budget & Finance Committee Representative to the County's Capital Projects Committee for a period of one (1) year, said term to expire on December 31, 2024.

BY ROLL CALL VOTE: SIX AYES. ONE NAY – LEGISLATOR MONTGOMERY. LEGISLATORS ADDONIZIO & NACERINO WERE ABSENT. MOTION CARRIES.

Item #8 – Recognition of Public on Agenda Items

Judith Farrell, Town of Philipstown Council Member stated that she was speaking about Item #7c – Appointment/ Budget & Finance Committee Representative/ Capital Projects Committee. She wanted to comment on Committees in general.

Chairman Jonke requested that it be specific to this item number appointing Legislator Ellner to the Capital Projects Committee.

Ms. Farrell stated that the people in the towns of Philipstown and Putnam Valley that have elected Legislator Montgomery as their Legislator believe that she deserves to be treated the same way the other eight Legislators are treated. She believed that the voters in Legislator Montgomery's district needed to be respected and Legislator Montgomery needed to be appointed to Committees to represent them.

Chairman Jonke explained that the Legislative rules regarding speaking to agenda items needed to be respected. He explained that Ms. Farrell was not speaking about the agenda item appointing Legislator Ellner to the Capital Projects Committee. He believed that part of the problem, which he will address in his remarks during Recognition of Legislators, is that Legislator Montgomery does not care about rules when she encouraged you to speak on an item that is not on the agenda.

Legislative Counsel Firriolo stated, as a point of information to the Chair and so that everyone understands, the Capital Projects Committee is not a standing Committee of the Legislature to which the Chair makes appointments. It is a Committee that is created by statute and has its own rules for appointments and confirmation by the Full Legislature. He stated that the Capital Projects is not a standing Committee, and standing Committees are not part of agenda items.

Janice Hogan, Town of Philipstown resident, stated that she would speak to Item #7c.

Legislator Montgomery stated that all the standing Committees are on the agenda.

Legislative Counsel Firriolo stated that it is the Chair's decision.

Ms. Hogan requested a moment to speak as a constituent of Legislator Montgomery's residing in District #1. She explained that Legislator Montgomery was elected as District #1 representative twice and she believed that Philipstown deserves to have a voice in what is happening in Putnam County. She requested that the Legislature set aside differences and to work together professionally. She stated that it did not make sense to have one (1) Legislator from any district not appointed to one (1) of the standing Committees. She explained that as Legislators of Putnam County, by not including Legislator Montgomery, the Legislature was excluding the Town of Philipstown.

Chairman Jonke again explained that this was not an agenda item.

Debbi Milner, Town of Philipstown resident, stated that she supports her neighbors and Legislator on this issue and requested an explanation of why their Legislator who represents them cannot represent them fully.

Chairman Jonke stated that he will be answering Ms. Milner question under recognition of Legislators.

Constancia Romilly, Town of Philipstown resident, read the title of agenda Item #7. She questioned how many working Committees there were.

Chairman Jonke stated that there were seven (7).

Ms. Romilly believed that it did not make sense to have nine (9) Legislators and seven (7) Committees and wind up having one (1) Legislator not serving on a Committee.

Linda Harris, Town of Kent resident, believed that all the Legislators needed to work together. Ms. Harris believed that since Legislator Montgomery was not given a Committee, perhaps she should have an oversight, watchdog Committee with all her constituents in the County.

John Allen, Town of Putnam Valley resident, questioned Item #7b – Confirmation/ Designation of Jail Chief Medical Officer. He thought it was determined in the County Charter that the Chief Medical Officer is not supposed to hold more than one (1) job. He stated that at one point he held four (4) different positions, including his private practice.

Chairman Jonke stated that if you leave your email address, we would try to get a response for you.

Karen Ertel, Garrison Hamlet of Philipstown resident, explained that she has learned from experience that by having repeated individuals serve on Committees does not serve in the best interest. A diverse Committee with people that share different ideas get much better results. She stated that if there are Legislators serving on four (4) or five (5) Committees, she asked if it could be reconsidered because she believed that a diverse Committee would produce a much better product for Putnam County residents.

County Executive Kevin Byrne, Town of Carmel resident, thanked the Legislature for approving Item #6c – Ratification of PuMA Collective Bargaining Agreement. He stated that there is a lot of work that goes into this, and many individuals involved in the negotiation process. However, a deal is not done until it is ratified by the Legislature.

Jean Hopper, Town of Carmel resident, questioned why the Committee meetings were not televised and shared with the public.

Chairman Jonke stated that approximately in June of 2023 he met with the head of the IT Department and approved the purchase of cameras and recording equipment. He stated that the installation in Room #318 should take place shortly and meetings will be televised approximately in April of this year.

Nick Kuvach, Town of Putnam Valley resident, spoke to the first agenda Item #1 – Pledge of Allegiance. He referenced the words, "justice for all" in the Pledge of Allegiance and stated that there is disproportionate representation of republicans versus democrats on the County Legislature.

Kathy Valletta, Town of Carmel resident, explained that the Legislature commended the Varsity Swin Team from Putnam Valley, Carmel, and Mahopac. She pointed out what was accomplished when these different and fierce competitors joined together. She asked the Legislators to listen to another view and let Legislator Montgomery speak in the closed-door meetings. She stated that we really want to work with the Legislature.

James Wiesler, Town of Philipstown resident, addressed the recording of the Committee meetings. He stated that he would leave his email address. He explained that he has experience in technology and would be happy to volunteer to help the Director of IT to expedite the process and set up the cameras.

Item #9 – Recognition of Legislators

Legislator Montgomery stated that February is Black History month, and the Putnam History Museum has done a fantastic job of providing information and cultural resources about Black history in the Hudson Highlands and Putnam County. She explained that there was another racial incident in Putnam County which she believed should be discussed. She stated that if anyone knows a victim of racism in Putnam County, please contact nohateforputnam@gmail.com or call 845-288-3252. She thanked the individuals who came to the meeting this evening to honor our firefighters and to defend democracy. She believed that there were a set of rules for eight Legislators and a different set for her, however, she stated that she will continue to have a voice for the people she represents. She explained that many of her initiatives, which the Legislators fought her on or refused to put on an agenda or acknowledged, are now being implemented as she mentioned earlier. She stated that she just returned from an amazing Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) weekend and studied her new hero, Aldo Leopold, the father of wildlife management. He stated that ethical behavior is doing the right thing when no one else is watching.

Legislator Ellner recognized a new family business in Carmel; Olde Tyme New York Hot Dogs. He stated that the owner is retired from the NYPD and is a veteran. He encouraged people to support this new business, as well as all of our local businesses.

Legislator Sayegh explained that the public can listen to our Legislative Committee meetings on SoundCloud. She encouraged people to visit the Legislature's website where the meetings are listed. She pointed out that in the past there was a Republican Legislator who did not receive any Committee assignments. She stated that there was also a long-standing Legislator who was a Democrat and served for 18 years. She stated

that he was very well liked and respected and served on many Committees. She stated that this was not partisan, and the rules apply to all. She stated that democracy happens at the ballot box. Each of the Legislators has a district and are voted for by the people of that district. She encouraged everyone to get out and vote.

Chairman Jonke stated that we all work very hard for our constituents, and he takes this job very seriously, as well as designating the Committee assignments. He stated that he did not select Legislator Montgomery to a Standing Committee, and he responded to her with a memorandum after receiving her memorandum asking him to reconsider this decision. Chairman Jonke proceeded to read the memorandum dated, January 25, 2024. which would clear up any misinformation and explain the reason for his decision not to appoint her to a Standing Committee. The memorandum explained how he extended an olive branch at the 2023 Organizational meeting to Legislator Montgomery who responded to him with condescending remarks after said meeting. The memorandum also listed eight (8) examples of how he believed Legislator Montgomery has disregarded the Legislature's rules of order and procedure, and how on numerous occasions made public comments that impugned the integrity of her fellow Legislators, and wrongly accusing them of improper conduct. Chairman Jonke's memorandum concluded by stating that although she is not a member of a Standing Committee, our procedure is to allow all Legislators to comment on agenda items during Committee meetings. He stated that her voice will continue to be heard at those meetings and he was sure that she would continue to represent the members of her district to the best of her ability.

There being no further business, at 8:13 P.M., Chairman Jonke made a motion to adjourn; seconded by Legislator Sayegh. Six Ayes, One Nay – Legislator Montgomery, Legislators Addonizio & Nacerino were absent. Motion carries.

Dear Commissioner Lewis,

We have Bell Hollow Road earmarked for the income tax reimbursement funds; we are seeking to have those funds redirected. Due to the storm of July 10th, unfortunately the Bell Hollow Road Culvert was undermined, resulting in FEMA declaring it an emergency site. The repair of that culvert and bridge will be funded by them, as the damage is much more extensive than the original scope of work to be done.

I wish to request that the money earmarked for this project be redirected and used for our Parks & Recreation Day Camp. Since the purchase of the camp in 2019, our goal has always been to winterize the facility so that it may be utilized by our community as much as possible, on a year-round basis. To achieve this goal, three buildings need to be addressed: the gym building, the rec "game room" and the cafeteria. We explored making the necessary repairs to all three buildings, with the possibility of winterizing one or two of them. We had received a matching grant from Senator Sue Serino for \$100,000 and were eager to get the project started. Unfortunately, plans were derailed in 2020 as a result of the pandemic, after which the \$100,000 was no longer a match, but merely represented approximately 20% of the costs of completing these projects.

The objectives for the scope of the work are set forth below:

- Bring the multi-use buildings up to current codes (both for building code and health and safety); and
- Expand the usage to the community through various programs that could run outside of the summer camp timeframes. (August-December, March-June)

The work was prioritized as follows:

Dining Room/Cafeteria (most usage considering both programming and possible rentals):

- Remove all Windows.
- Furnish and Install (36) double hung windows, (1) sliding window, (22) Fixed Casement Windows.
- Remove all exterior doors and screens.
- Furnish and Install (1) double door no glass exterior door unit with trim (4) pre-hung solid exterior door units with trim and hardware; (1) wooden screen door and (1) double screen door with hardware.

- · Paint trim only.
- Floor Finish: Remove existing floor tile, furnish and install similar style floor file, approximately 4,000 square foot.
- Porch Area: Remove existing screen and replace it; frame in bottom section length of building and install ½ Azek plywood. Remove rotted section of 5/4 x 3 fir flooring; furnish and install new 5/4 x 3 fir deck flooring; paint area repaired.
- Bathroom: Remove sink and toilet; furnish and install new wall hung sink with a new faucet; furnishing and install new toilet.

Gym Facility (also considering both programming and possible rentals):

Roof: Remove existing shingles. Remove ¾ T&G plywood sheeting. Furnish and install high temperature ice and water shield; furnish and install standing seam metal roof (green).

Remove existing double exterior doors; furnish and install (4) new double exterior doors with appropriate hardware.

Remove existing lighting; furnish and install new led lighting with (1) switch.

Remove upper windows and replace with metal or fiberglass siding.

Remove and replace (6) gutters.

Remove black top and prep for concrete floor.

Furnish and install concrete floor.

Repair (2) garage door springs.

Remove all debris from job site.

As stated above, we were prepared, budget-wise, to complete the required work and were in a position to move forward with the project, before Covid-19 took hold. Unfortunately, costs ballooned over the course of the pandemic, and with the high rate of inflation that followed, raised the estimated expenditure on the smallest building, for example, from \$210,000 to over \$450,000. With the total cost for the entire project now standing at \$910,000 at prevailing wage, this makes funding simply unfeasible. It is, however, our hope that, with the assistance of the funds from the county sales tax revenue, this project could become a reality. The winterization of our day camp would be a huge benefit to our community, and would also assist the town by offsetting property taxes through rentals of the facilities for private events.

Arts Link Community Grant Program 2024 Overview

The Putnam Arts Council serves as an umbrella organization receiving and disseminating public funds from Putnam County Government as well as public funds from the New York State Council on the Arts, a State Agency, with support from the NYS Office of the Governor and the NYS Legislature. Through the Arts Council's *Arts Link Community Grant Program*, applications are received and reviewed, and funding awards are determined. Grant requests to the Arts Link Program always exceed funds available and each year the process is most competitive.

The Arts Link Community Grant Program is managed and monitored by the Putnam Arts Council and provides public funds to artists, arts organizations, and community non-profits, fostering quality arts projects and activities that are open to the public and offered throughout Putnam County. Goals of the Arts Link Program include supporting programs that enrich and elevate the quality of life for County residents, expanding opportunities for artists and arts organizations and developing audiences for the arts. The Program also connects artists with their communities, promotes an exchange of ideas, and encourages economic development through cultural tourism (for every \$1 spent \$7 is generated).

Our Program is comprised of an ongoing and detailed process:

- The first step is to provide technical assistance to each potential applicant through informational seminars and meetings held at sites on both sides of Putnam County. Informational seminars are presented by the Executive Director along with our Grants Coordinator.
- The second step is to create an independent panel of individuals from throughout the County who are willing and able to review the applications and make informed funding recommendations. The review panel is representative of a variety of community members and a variety of backgrounds and interests who reside throughout the Putnam County area.
- The third step is to familiarize new panel members with regrant program goals, policies and procedures and provide the entire panel with copies of applications for review.
- The fourth step is to convene the panel to discuss, review, and consider each application.
- The progress and success of each funded project is monitored through mid-year and final reports from the recipients as well as through ongoing audits by PAC representatives.

The 2024 Program received 27 application requests totaling \$92,725 with available Program funding at \$13,993 from Putnam County and \$30,800 from NYS. Total funding requests represent a 19.2% increase over FY22 with level funding being received from both the County and the State over FY22.

The 2024 Program will support 26 grants, 13 of which will receive funding through County dollars. Some projects receive only Putnam County dollars while others receive a combination of County and State funds. Some receive only State funds. We have provided a summary of County funded projects.

The Program serves residents of all ages and interests including children, teens and seniors, veterans, and individuals with special needs, with quality arts projects that are open to the public. The Program fosters work opportunities for visual, performing, and literary artists from Putnam County and the region. This year the Program will support projects in music, dance, theater, literature, multi-disciplinary projects, as well as visual arts, arts, and site- specific outdoor sculpture.

An independent panel of community members meets to review and evaluate all applications and to recommend funding for the projects. The panel is comprised of artists and community members who are familiar with the arts and in general have attended art programs in Putnam County. Evaluations are based on the projects quality as well as its ability to reach a broad audience, generate the most benefit to the community, and support the opportunities for artists and arts groups. Program diversity (visual, performing, literary) is also a consideration. Ratings determine funding decisions which are calculated and presented to Putnam County Legislature for their consideration. The Board of the Putnam Arts Council reviews panel recommendations as well.

100% of the \$13,993 in Art Link Grant funding is disseminated to applicants to support projects that are open to the Public and will be presented in 2024. We are in the process of planning an Awards Ceremony to recognize organizations and projects that will be funded as well as to recognize the public funding sources that make this program possible.

The Arts Council stays connected to the Program's award recipients year-round providing guidance and technical support as needed. Projects are audited by PAC staff and panel members as well as Board and community volunteers. PAC requires final project reports.

PAC helps to market the projects through advertising on our website as well as in print through our bi-monthly *Cultural Arts Calendar*. The *Calendar* is made available at public sites throughout the County as well as at sites where funded projects are taking place (i.e., libraries, art centers, historical sites etc.).

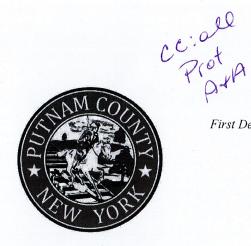

Adjustment

The Putnam County Office for Senior Resources requests approval for an increase in the salary for the Nutrition Services Manager position from \$73,725 to \$82,000, an increase of \$8,275.

Some background - the final, approved 2024 Budget had provided for:

- Job title change Nutrition Services Coordinator to Nutrition Services Manager for OSR' most senior nutrition position
- Reclassification of a Cook position to Head Cook, severing that functionality from the Nutrition Services Coordinator role. The incumbent in that position will now serve as Head Cook.

Recruitment has been difficult for the Nutrition Services Manager role and OSR is requesting this salary increase to improve the attractiveness of the position. To date, after 2 months plus of posting, we have only 3 interested candidates; 1 had declined an interview and had accepted a position at a higher salary with another employer. Another highly qualified candidate with significant experience in a senior nutrition environment and a comparable position in another County Office for the Aging, is interested but seeks a comparable wage and is not interested in a cut in salary.

We propose to fund this adjustment as follows. For the 2024 Final Budget:

- the Nutrition Services Coordinator salary carried over to the Manager salary with no change at \$73,725 (position number 6772 10140).
- The Head Cook position will be underfilled at \$61,500 but is budgeted for \$72,563, a difference of \$9,888
- We propose to transfer funds from this position line to cover the proposed salary increase.
- The salary adjustment will not result in an increase to the 2024 OSR Budget

The Personnel Department is seeking the passage of an amended resolution for the appointment of Sara Servadio, Commissioner of Social Services, Mental Health, and Youth Bureau. On December 5, 2023, the Putnam County Legislature passed Resolution # 240 of 2023 appointing Sara Servadio as Commissioner of Social Services, Mental Health, and Youth Bureau for the remainder of previous Commissioner, Michael Piazza's term, ending April 1, 2024. Commissioner Servadio was then to commence a new five-year term.

The Personnel Department was subsequently contacted by the New York State Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA) requesting an amendment to the resolution appointing Sara Servadio as Commissioner of Social Services, Mental Health, and Youth Bureau. The OTDA's Counsel Office has rendered an opinion regarding the interpretation of Social Services Law § 116, determining that the five-year term should start upon the appointment of a new commissioner.

It had been the position of the Putnam County Personnel and Law Departments that in the event of a vacancy prior to the completion of a term, New York State Public Officer §38 law dictates that the next appointee would complete the remainder of the unfinished term prior to commencing their own. It is the opinion of OTDA's Counsel Office that Social Services Law requires a new term. Moreover, Social Services Law requires state approval for Commissioner appointments.

It is for this reason that we are seeking to amend Resolution 240 of 2023 and appoint Sara Servadio to a five-year term effective November 10, 2023.

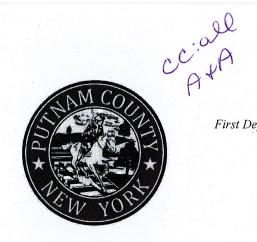
