# But this is just a Band-Aid, we focused on a starting point of the epidemic and joined the lawsuit against Big Pharma



 With the support of the Legislature, Putnam County joined a lawsuit holding pharmaceutical companies accountable for deceptive marketing practices and other illicit behaviors that led to the addiction epidemic

 The lawsuit seeks compensation for the unnecessary costs that were incurred as a result of prescription opioid abuse

#### Through the District Attorney's Office and the ODMapping Program we are able to provide focused education, prevention and police resources



- The ODMapping Program will be used as a tool to help law enforcement and treatment providers in identifying overdoses both fatal and non-fatal and identify any clusters
- Developing a system of care for people that have OD'd to reach out and attempt to engage them in treatment
- 2018 there were 151 OD calls involving EMS response, 80 were transported, 18 fatal overdoses, 38 non-fatal

- In October & December of 2018 the Legislature presented 2 Resolutions to create new local laws that among other things restricts the sale of tobacco & E-Cigarette products to anyone under the age of 21
- The County Executive immediately signed the Resolutions into Local Law

## We committed the resources, including funding as necessary to directly combat the problem



We hired a Drug Treatment Coordinator and continue to fully support Judge Reitz and his commitment to Treatment Court

- From 2012 2018 there have been 195 graduates from our nationally recognized Drug Treatment Court
- Drug Treatment Court provides supervision and guidance rather than incarceration which would cost \$60k annually per prisoner
- This results in a savings to the taxpayers of \$1.95m annually

## "Cuomo backs recreational marijuana legalization, but at what cost, drug policy expert asks"

Kevin A. Sabet, PhD, is an author, consultant, former advisor to three U.S. presidential administrations, assistant professor, and serves as the President and CEO of SAM (Smart Approaches to Marijuana), which he founded with former Congressman Patrick Kennedy in 2013

"In Colorado, where marijuana-related offenses have now surpassed other infractions, former Gov. John Hickenlooper projected the state would rake in \$118 million in pot taxes the first year of legalization

In reality, it only brought in around \$67 million, well short of the promised windfall."

### What About The Cost To Society?


According to a study commissioned by the Centennial Institute in Lakewood Colorado for every \$1 gained in tax revenue, Coloradans spent approximately \$4.50 to mitigate the effects of legalization



The effects of marijuana aren't limited to our pocketbooks

From the New York Post, Melissa Klein, December 29, 2018

- In Colorado, where pot sales began in 2014, 69 percent of pot users said they had driven while high at least once in the past year and 27 percent said they drove stoned almost daily
- The number of **fatal car accidents** in Colorado increased by **40** percent from 2013 to 2015.
- And drivers in fatal accidents testing positive for pot rose by 145 percent from 2013 to 2016



A survey of 12th grade students in Putnam County showed that marijuana use is more common than daily cigarette use and it's not even legal yet



34% of our 12th grade students are actively vaping and we have been working with our local school districts to address this latest trend



Dr. Sabet, discusses the false opinion that making drugs legal would eliminate the black market

"we know the illicit market does not go away under legalization. In fact, there are signs it's growing stronger. The situation is so bad, foreign cartels and criminal gangs are turning whole neighborhoods into pot growing operations and even growing the drug on public lands"



As Dr. Sabet said:

"Cuomo is being led astray by Big Marijuana and, if they are successful, New Yorkers will have to pay the price. Big Marijuana and its Big Tobacco and Big Alcohol investors don't care about tax revenues, or social justice. They only care about profits."

# Newsweek

From an article on Newsweek.com 1/23/19 by Tim Marcini, Former New York City Mayor Michael Bloomberg weighed in saying:

"Last year, in 2017, 72,000 Americans [overdosed] on drugs. In 2018, more people than that are OD-ing on drugs, have OD'd on drugs. And today, incidentally, we are trying to legalize another addictive narcotic, which is perhaps the *stupidest thing anybody has ever done*."

#### NEW YORK STATE'S LOCAL HEALTH DEPARTMENTS EXPRESS SERIOUS CONCERNS ABOUT LEGALIZED MARIJUANA

Health Leaders Urge State to Approach Legalization Thoughtfully and With

Extreme Caution

The New York State Association of County Health Officials (NYSACHO), representing all S8 local health departments in New York State, today expressed serious concerns about the legalization of an adult use regulated marijuana program, and called on lawmakers to approach legalization thoughtfully and with excreme countin.

The concerns expressed by NYSACHO stem from research substantiating that the use and availability of marijuana carries numerous risks, including: future high-risk of addiction to other drugs; harmful cognitive and academic effects; adverse cardiac and respiratory effects; unintentional exposures to children; and motor vehicle accidents.

It was for these reasons that NYSACHO earlier this year submitted a memorandum of opposition to be galized recreational marijuana use. Fundamentally, NYSACHO remains opposed to the recreational use of marijuana. If such a policy is revertheless eracted and is true to the State Health Department's standard of 'doing more good than harm,' NYSACHO is calling for the establishment of critical safeguards before sales are legalized, including, but not limited to:

Setting the legal age of sale at 21 years of age in combination with adoption of Tobacco 21 policy at the state-level.







**Putnam County Hazardous Waste Disposal Events** provide our residents with a safe and responsible way to dispose of items that cannot be disposed of through normal garbage/recycling collection

- The Putnam County Department of Health (DOH) conducts two events a year which are staffed by trained DOH employees
- In 2018 we collected over 93k pounds of household hazardous waste from 452 residents which was collected and safely disposed of
- We are scheduling two events for 2019

Do you know what's in your house?



We found out just how important this collection event is when a resident attempted to dispose of dangerous and highly explosive chemicals at our October 6<sup>th</sup> Event

- Our DOH staff immediately recognized the danger and instituted our safety procedures

# The primary scorecard factor is Fund Balance

- The National Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) recommends that counties carry a minimum general fund unassigned fund balance of two months of General Fund Operating expenses which for Putnam County equals \$23.6m
- In 2018 Putnam County ended the fiscal year with an unassigned General Fund Balance of \$23.8m meeting this guideline




- Going back to our "roots" we headed to the soil and planted and harvested crops on 1/3 of an acre





## Before we end tonight's presentation we would like to take a moment and remember a Putnam County resident who gave his life in service to his country





Mahopac native Chief Warrant Officer Michael Kozloski was killed while on duty during an accident at the Coast Guard buoy facility in Homer Alaska on January 31, 2019

CWO Kozloski was 35 years old

A loving husband and father to 4 children CWO Kozloski served with the United States Coast Guard for 17 years and was assigned as the First Lieutenant aboard the Coast Guard Cutter Hickory "It is foolish and wrong to mourn the men who died. Rather we should thank God that such men lived."
