Item #12 – Proposal by Legislator Montgomery – Funding for Philipstown Behavioral Health Hub \$25,000.

Legislator Montgomery stated that the Philipstown Behavioral Health Hub had previously came before the Legislature and presented their program. She stated that she also provided statistics and data with this request. She stated that this program is meeting a need on the westside of the County. She believed this mental health first aid program could go a long way in serving all of Putnam County. She stated that the Behavioral Health Hub have already been in the schools implementing this program and they would like to expand it and tweak it to meet the needs of different populations from seniors, young adults and children, to training police departments. She stated that she did not bring this particular program to the County Executive, however, various programs have

been brought to the County Executive throughout the years and none were ever acknowledged. She stated that when the Behavioral Health Hub went before the County Executive for ARPA funding, the County Executive made a comment that she never heard of the HUB. She stated that she often needs to strategize how she makes proposals to the Legislature, and nothing has worked. She stated that she is now presenting a proposal to help increase resources for mental health in the County.

Legislator Jonke stated that there was a motion and a second on this item. He questioned if there was a vote to put this on for other business.

Legislative Counsel Firriolo stated that it did not need to be moved on for other business because it was pre-filed as a resolution. He understood that the motion and the second was on the resolution itself and now it proceeds to a vote after discussion.

Chairman Sullivan stated that he thought it was a motion to put it on as other business.

Legislative Counsel Firriolo stated that anything that came from a Committee does not need to be moved forward and anything that was on the agenda, but not from a Committee would need a second for the resolution but not to get on the agenda. It is automatically on the agenda because the topic is budget, and it is a budget item and did not need to be accepted as other business. However, if that was the intent of your motion, then a motion and a second on the resolution still needs to be made before it can be voted on. He stated that you cannot be held to a motion that you did not intend to make.

Chairman Sullivan questioned if Legislator Montgomery wanted to make the motion for the item to be considered.

Legislator Montgomery made a motion to adopt the change to the budget for this item; seconded by Legislator Gouldman.

He stated that they would like to use \$5,000 of the \$10,000 to bring the position up to \$80,000 and place the remaining \$5,000 back into the general fund.

Legislator Jonke questioned if the remaining \$5,000 should be left in subcontingency at the discretion of the District Attorney to use for other employees.

Legislator Nacerino wanted clarification that the District Attorney recently requested the vacant position to increase from \$70,000 to \$75,000 because he could not attract a candidate. She questioned if we recently hired an ADA at \$75,000 and now we are bumping it up to \$80,000.

Chairman Sullivan believed it was.

Legislator Jonke questioned if that was the position we discussed.

Chief Deputy Commissioner of Finance Lewis believed it was.
