Monday 6:30pm June 26, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 6:30pm by Chairman Castellano who requested Legislator Sayegh lead in the Pledge of Allegiance. Upon roll call Legislator Ellner and Chairman Castellano were present. Legislator Gouldman was absent. Legislator Sayegh sat on the Committee in Legislator Gouldman's absence.

Item #3 – Acceptance of Minutes – April 24, 2023 & May 22, 2023

The minutes were accepted as submitted.

Item #4 - Correspondence/County Auditor

a. Sales Tax Report

Legislator Ellner requested clarification on the projection for the first quarter, which seems to be a decrease as compared to last year.

Interim Commissioner of Finance Michael Lewis stated a payment will be received this week for the reconciliation of the first quarter in 2023.

Interim Commissioner Lewis stated this is \$750,000 spread over three (3) years, \$250,000 per year. He stated the \$250,000 for year two (2) will be included in the 2024 County budget.

Legislator Crowley questioned how much of this is used per year in Putnam County.

Interim Commissioner Lewis stated he would send that information to the Legislature. He stated anything not used would be carried over.

Legislator Crowley questioned how many County Attorneys participate and how much money is used in Putnam County.

Interim Commissioner Lewis stated he would provide the requested information.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

e. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A037/ Sheriff's Dept./ SAM Grant Award/ Purchase Various Equipment (Also reviewed in Protective)

Legislator Crowley questioned if the Sheriff's Department still has an accident reconstruction unit.

Sheriff McConville stated the Sheriff's Department is awaiting receipt of a \$100,000 grant which will allow them to purchase a program called 3D FARO, which greatly aids in accident reconstruction. He stated once the Department receives that with formal training it will utilized. He stated there are currently members of an accident reconstruction unit, but they are out of training and therefore have not been used. He stated the State Police are called upon for accident reconstruction when necessary.

Legislator Crowley stated it is her understanding funding was received in the past for equipment and training.

Sheriff McConville stated the Department still has the equipment and training standards and certification letters are being reviewed.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

f. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A038/ Youth Bureau/ Adjusted State Aid Allocations for Runaway & Homeless Youth Programs

Interim Commissioner Lewis stated this is the final allocation from January to September 2023; this grant follows a Federal fiscal year which runs from October 1st to September 30th. He stated this is a one-time adjustment for this allocation.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Ellner. All in favor.

Item #6 – Approval/ Fund Transfer 23T139/ Office for Senior Resources/ Increase Hours to Close Out Project

Chairman Castellano made a motion to approve Fund Transfer 23T139; Seconded by Legislator Sayegh. All in favor.

Legislator Crowley questioned if the Sheriff's Department's bicycle patrol was seasonal.

Sheriff McConville stated yes, it is.

Legislator Crowley questioned if the allocation for the bicycle patrol is \$15,000.

Sheriff McConville stated that is correct.

Legislator Crowley questioned why funds are being borrowed from this line already if the season just began.

Sheriff McConville stated with the deployment schedule they will be able to have the patrol without expending those funds. He stated there are no restrictions on comp time and they need to be paid out when requested.

Legislator Crowley questioned if an officer was being removed from the road to be put on bicycle patrol.

Sheriff McConville stated no, because of their deployment schedule they have sufficient personnel to cover.

Legislator Sayegh questioned how many employees would be covered by this \$65,000 transfer.

Sheriff McConville stated it is difficult to determine how many employees would be covered because there are varying salary levels.

Interim Commissioner Lewis stated the maximum number of hours that can be accrued in 480. He stated when cashed in, those hours are paid at time and a half at their highest rate of pay.

Legislator Ellner questioned where the funds go if not all utilized.

Interim Commissioner Lewis stated they will go back into the general fund.

Chairman Castellano stated the comp time can be cashed in at any point, making it difficult to predict.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to pre-file the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Sayegh. All in favor.

Audit Results

We have completed our audit of the 2022 financial statements of the County of Putnam in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. The objective of our audit was to obtain reasonable assurance about whether these financial statements are free of material misstatement. As part of the scope of our work, we reviewed management's accounting estimates and the accounting treatment afforded to all significant accounting matters.

Audit Scope

Our audit approach was directed at the evaluation of all significant aspects of the County's operations to reduce audit risks to an acceptable level. Our primary focus was not on individual transactions and balances but on the financial statements we are opining on taken as a whole. We are satisfied that the scope of our audit was sufficient to enable us to express our opinion on these financial statements.

We have issued an unmodified ("clean") opinion relating to the County of Putnam as of December 31, 2022 and for the year then ended.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE PUTNAM COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE AND THE UNITED STATES SECRET SERVICE

The Putnam County Sheriff's Office (PCSO) and the United States Secret Service (Secret Service) enter into this memorandum of understanding (MOU), which becomes effective with the signatures of both parties and remains in effect until terminated by the mutual agreement of the PCSO and the Secret Service or upon 30 day written notice by either party to this agreement.

I. AUTHORITY

This MOU is established pursuant to Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056 and provisions of Public Law 107-56, Title I, Section 105, the Uniting and Strengthening of America by Providing Appropriate Tools Required to Intercept and Obstruct Terrorism (USA PATRIOT) Act of 2001. This act directed the Secret Service to take appropriate actions to expand the national network of Electronic Crimes Task Forces (ECTF) throughout the United States. The Secret Service has since consolidated its Financial Crimes Task Forces with its ECTFs, renaming the consolidated task forces as its Cyber Fraud Task Forces (CFTFs).

This MOU is established pursuant to provisions of the Treasury Forfeiture Fund Act of 1992, 31 U.S.C. § 9705, as amended. This act established the Department of the Treasury Forfeiture Fund and authorized the payment of certain overtime expenditures, travel, fuel, training, equipment, and other similar costs of State and Local law enforcement officers, that are involved in joint operations, with a Department of the Treasury law enforcement organization, as prescribed in 31 U.S.C. § 9705 (a)(1)(I) (hereinafter "overtime costs and other expenses").

II. PURPOSE

This MOU establishes the procedures and responsibilities of both the Putnam County Sheriff's Office and the Secret Service for the reimbursement of certain overtime costs and other expenses pursuant to 31 U.S.C. § 9705.

III. CONDITIONS AND PROCEDURES

The parties agree to the following conditions:

(a) The PCSO may request reimbursement of payment of overtime costs and other expenses directly related to work performed by its officer(s) assigned to assist the Secret Service CFTF in conducting official investigations. The PCSO will submit all requests for reimbursement payments, together with appropriate documentation, to the Secret Service CFTF supervisor. Request for

- reimbursement will be based solely upon overtime worked and other expenses performed on behalf of the Secret Service CFTF.
- (b) All reimbursement hours of overtime costs and all other expenses covered under this MOU must be approved and certified by the Secret Service CFTF supervisor. The reimbursable overtime payments will be based upon the actual hourly overtime rate, exclusive of matching employer contributions for any taxes or benefits.
- (c) The Secret Service CFTF supervisor will forward all approved reimbursement requests through the Special Agent in Charge (SAIC) of the Criminal Investigative Division, Office of Investigations, to the Treasury Forfeiture Fund's payment agent, the U.S. Customs National Finance Center (NFC).
- (d) During the period of assignment to the Secret Service CFTF, the PCSO will remain responsible for establishing the salary and benefits, including overtime of the officer(s) assigned to the CFTF and making all payments due them. Reimbursement under this MOU is contingent upon the availability of mandatory funds allocated to the Secret Service through the Department of the Treasury Forfeiture Fund.
- (e) The PCSO shall permit and have readily available for examination and auditing by the Secret Service, the U.S. Department of Treasury, the Comptroller of the United States, and any of their duly authorized agents and representatives, any and all records, documents, accounts, invoices, receipts or expenditures relating to this agreement. They shall maintain all such records and reports until all audits and examinations are completed and resolved, or for a period of three (3) years, whichever is sooner.
- (f) Payments may be made to the extent they are included in the Secret Service Fiscal Year Plan and the monies are available within the Department of Treasury Forfeiture Fund to satisfy the request(s) for reimbursable expenses. It should also be understood that the total amount(s) made available to the Secret Service through the Department of the Treasury Forfeiture Fund, for reimbursement to the PCSO, could change at any time.
- (g) Pursuant to the Treasury Executive Office for Asset Forfeiture (TEOAF) directive number 18, the maximum reimbursement entitlement for overtime costs to any one law enforcement official cannot exceed fifteen-thousand (\$15,000.00) dollars during the fiscal year.
- (h) This document does not obligate funds. Funding authority will be provided through other documents.
- (i) The PCSO shall provide the Secret Service within 10 days of the signing of this MOU, with their agency's mailing address, contact name, telephone number and tax identification number. Further, this agency must provide the name, account number and ABA routing number of the financial institution where the PCSO wants the Electronic Funds transfer (EFT) payment deposited for the

reimbursement of overtime salary costs. Failure to provide this information within the prescribed period of time will nullify this MOU agreement.

IV. REVISIONS

The terms of this MOU may be amended upon the written approval of both the PCSO and the Secret Service. Such amendment is effective upon the date of approval.

In February 2023, NYS Department of Health announced the Public Health Infrastructure, Workforce, and Data Systems Grant. Putnam County Department of Health was awarded \$692,296 over a five-year period through Health Research Incorporated (HRI) for the purpose of strengthening the workforce and foundational capabilities of the county public health department. The current Grant period is 12/1/2022-11/30/2027. NYSDOH has notified all local health departments to budget the entire allocated award, despite the 12/1/2022 start date. Currently, we are budgeting for a full-time Public Health Data and Informatics Specialist and a part-time Quality Improvement/Performance Management (QIPM) Coordinator (Please see attached draft Job Specifications).

The annual salary for the Public Health Data and Informatics Specialist starts at \$79,031 with a 2.00% COLA raise per year. Fringe Benefits are also budgeted annually with a 2% increase per year. Recommended salaries and job specifications were provided by the Personnel Department based on scope of duties and compensation from surrounding counties. The QIPM Coordinator position is 21 hours per week, at an hourly rate of \$43.42. Fringes (FICA) for the part-time position has also been budgeted. The expected start date for both positions is approximately 10/1/2023.

In addition to salaries and benefits, funding for training and education has been included within this Amendment.

Also attached is an Excel spreadsheet delineating the anticipated full Award Expenditures over the five-year Grant period. The first year beginning 10/1/2023 has been prorated, also 2027, the final year of the Grant, has been prorated. We will include a Budget in 2024 and subsequent years.

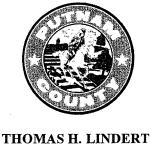
