The meeting was called to order at 6:31pm by Chairman Castellano who requested Legislator Gouldman lead in the Pledge of Allegiance. Upon roll call Legislators Ellner and Gouldman and Chairman Castellano were present.

Chairman Castellano requested clarification on the last column on the report as it is different than previous reports.

First Deputy Commissioner of Finance Sheila Barrett stated the Munis system presents the numbers in a percentage, but the percentage can be misleading if there is a negative balance. She stated she believed it was important to show the negatives, therefore the last column was added.

f. Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A084/ Health Dept./ Rabies Grant Reimbursed Feral Cat Trap Neuter Spay Expenses

Director of Environmental Health Shawn Rogan stated this is money that was left in the current grant and the New York State Department of Health approved rolling the money over and earmarking it for the Feral Cat Task Force. He stated this program reimburses the volunteers in Putnam County who capture feral cats in the community, get them spayed or neutered, and vaccinated for rabies. He stated the ears of the cats are clipped so they can be identified as being vaccinated in the future. He stated the cats are then returned to the wild where they were captured, or they are adopted out if they are determined to be adoptable. He stated this additional funding will increase the numbers of cats the Task Force is able to help.

Chairman Castellano questioned how many feral cats are in Putnam County.

Director Rogan stated he does not know, but this program helps. He stated most importantly this program helps the concern for rabies exposure. He stated if a resident has contact with a feral cat, they can avoid unnecessary rabies treatment if they see the clipped ear of the cat. He stated comparatively, rabies treatment is a much larger expense than this proactive program.

Chairman Castellano questioned what the ear of the cat would look like.

Director Rogan stated they make a notch in the ear.

Legislator Addonizio stated this is a wonderful program. She shared that she recently helped a constituent connect with the Feral Cat Task Force and was surprised to hear the constituent was unaware it was in place.

Director Rogan stated they are certainly a very busy group. He stated Putnam County contributes to this program as well as some towns including Kent, Patterson, and Putnam Valley.

Legislator Montgomery stated she is aware of some individuals who do similar work in their neighborhoods at their own expense.

Chairman Castellano made a motion to prefile the necessary resolution; Seconded by Legislator Gouldman. All in favor.

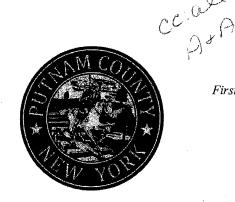

Commissioner Lewis,

As you are aware, I have handed in my retirement papers, and my last day as Tourism Director is 12/31/23. After conversations with the County Executive and Personnel Director, I am very interested and would look forward to continuing working for the County in Tourism on a part-time basis.

I am requesting the following budgetary amendments to the 2024 Tourism Budget:

- Adjusting the I Love NY Budgetary Line down \$16,522 from \$120,000 to the correct amount of \$103,478. Lam requesting this change because I Love NY awarded only \$51,739 and not the \$60k that was requested. Lam further requesting that the County portion of the \$16,522 (\$8,261) be moved to the Temporary line (\$1094).
- Adjusting the Tourism Director salary line from \$89,167 to \$85,000 and moving \$4,000 to the Temporary Line (51094).
- Moving \$4,739 from the Misc. line to the Temporary line (51094).

These adjustments will increase the Temporary Line from \$15,510 to \$32,510 and create the opportunity for me to stay on in a part-time capacity (at \$22,000 per year) as an assistant and resource to the new Tourism Director. The remaining \$10,500 in the Temporary Line would be used to fund an administrative assistant position. These budgetary amendments would create no change to the 2024 Tourism Budget and would be at no additional cost to the taxpayers.

I am proud to say that according to the most recent report from Tourism Economics, Putnam County Tourism generated \$78M from traveler spending. This represents year over year growth of \$16.9M which is an increase of 24.8%.

Putnam County Tourism is an advocate and champion for Putnam County. It is a revenue generator and an investment in the county which benefits every one of its residents.

I respectfully request that these amendments be approved so that I may continue to be a part of this small but important team.

#### I. Purpose

The purpose of this Local Commissioners Memorandum (LCM) is to advise municipal youth bureaus on the availability of Youth Development Program (YDP), Runaway and Homeless Youth (RHY), and Youth Sports and Education Opportunity Funding (YSEF) allocations for program year October 1, 2023 – September 30, 2024.

### II. Background

The New York State Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) issues YDP, RHY, and YSEF allocations to municipal youth bureaus. Each youth bureau must submit a Resource Allocation Plan (RAP) to OCFS that indicates how these funds will be utilized. Counties are also required to submit an annual Child and Family Services Plan (CFSP) and/or a CFSP update to OCFS. Among other topics, these plans articulate how the county will administer and support RHY and youth development programming. Programs and services must be included in the appropriate section(s) of a county's CFSP to be eligible for YDP or RHY state aid.

Additional details about completing the CFSP can be found in <u>23-OCFS-LCM-06</u>, <u>Guidelines and Instructions for Preparing the Child and Family Services Annual Plan Update</u>, and in the resource documents embedded within the CFSP portal. The CFSP portal can be accessed at <a href="https://countyplans.ocfs.ny.gov/log-in/">https://countyplans.ocfs.ny.gov/log-in/</a>.

In rare instances, a county may identify mid-year that they have been allocated YDP, RHY, and/or YSEF funds that they cannot spend or claim. When this occurs, counties are encouraged to contact OCFS as soon as possible. Sharing this information with OCFS may allow those unused funds to be moved to another county with similar programming and demonstrated fiscal need. Counties demonstrate fiscal need — and therefore may become eligible to receive additional funds should they become available — by accurately completing the RAP.

#### **YDP**

Eligible expenses and claiming processes remain unchanged from previous years. Additional details about the RAP submission and approval process can be found in guidance documents on the home page of the Quality Youth Development System (QYDS) at <a href="https://hs.ocfs.ny.gov/qyds/">https://hs.ocfs.ny.gov/qyds/</a>. State share is available for 100% of eligible expenditures as included in the approved RAP. Claims are due September 30, 2025.

The allocations are distributed using each county's allocation percentage compared to the total funds, as determined in the calendar year 2016 Spending Plan. OCFS expects to review this methodology in upcoming program years.

#### RHY

Eligible expenses and claiming processes remain unchanged from previous years with the following exception: effective program year 2023-2024, a county may use up to **10**% of its RHY allocation to support the salary of the municipal RHY service coordinator, with limited exceptions. The remaining 90% must go toward RHY programming.

An exception may be made when the only RHY service in a county is non-residential programming provided directly by the RHY service coordinator. In this instance, the work of the coordinator is both administrative and programmatic, thus the 10% cap does not apply.

A total of \$4,984,000 is allocated in accordance with each county's proportion of OCFS-certified beds. The additional allocation of \$2.1 million is distributed based on each county's proportion of Transitional Independent Living Support Program beds. Counties that only offer non-residential services are capped at \$15,000. State share is available for 60% of eligible expenditures as included in the approved RAP. Claims are due 12 months after the calendar quarter in which services were delivered.

Additional information can be found in the 2024 RHY claiming guide.

#### **YSEF**

YSEF awards are guided by the following principles:

- Sports are effective tools in positive youth development and family engagement.
- Sports improve the lives of young people by promoting positive social, emotional, health, and educational outcomes and have important life-long effects.
- Sports enable opportunities for young people to thrive through leadership roles.
- Coaching education greatly improves young people's sports experience and development outcomes.

Funded programs must provide a variety of sports for a broad range of youth in under-resourced communities. OCFS encourages a wide and flexible definition of sports that encompasses any organized activities with movement, including physical fitness activities such as yoga, hiking, dance, and active outdoor pursuits.

To ensure that funding is going to the intended population, municipal youth bureaus must distribute funds based on local need,<sup>1</sup> considering factors including, but not limited to the following:

- historically under-resourced communities;
- · public housing;
- high rates of family homelessness;
- Opportunity Zones or neighborhoods/cities/areas deemed "low-income" via externally available tools like the New York State Council on Children and Families Kids' Well-being Indicators Clearinghouse;
- marginalized communities or groups with higher barriers to participation in sports (e.g., youth with disabilities; girls; transgender/gender non-binary youth; and youth who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, or questioning);
- federally and/or New York State-recognized tribes and tribal organizations; and
- neighborhoods that experience higher rates of crime and violence and have lower-performing schools.

Additionally, municipal youth bureaus should give priority consideration to programs that serve youth identifying as Black, indigenous, or people of color, as well as to providers of adaptive sports for youth with physical disabilities.

All funded programs must aim to foster the following:

- Educational connection and achievement More youth attending and completing school with increased attainment, including collegiate placement success
- Physical health and well-being Increasing physical activity and positive relationships to one's body and physical activity
- Mental health and well-being Improving outcomes related to youth's mental health and social and emotional skills development and connectedness
- Employment Increasing qualifications and skills, such as collective problem-solving, teamwork, and dispute resolution, which help prepare youth for suitable employment
- Community cohesion Breaking down barriers to reduce discrimination, crime, and violence in communities and help young leaders emerge

#### Eligibility and Funding

Municipal youth bureaus will contract with local organizations, municipalities, and/or local or municipal youth bureaus directly for up to \$50,000 per program. Organizations that serve multiple areas through different programs may be funded above \$50,000. Funding may provide general operating dollars to give programs flexibility to efficiently allocate resources for quality programming. Line-item budgets should focus on programming costs, including, but not limited to, the following:

- Coaches/instructors/direct service staff/mentors (including training/professional development)
- Equipment
- Educational programming costs
- Facility/field space cost
- A maximum of 15% of program funds may be used to support administrative/overhead costs

Programs eligible for funding must meet the criteria below:

- Provide structured sports activities for youth ages 6-17
- Serve youth in New York State
- Demonstrate basic competency in the areas of governance, monitoring and evaluation, partnership, and financial stewardship
- Have a child protection policy in place that includes adherence to local city, agency, school district, and state child protection guidelines
- Collect registration data, including participant demographic information, as required by OCFS in a manner that allows for accurate reporting of anonymized aggregate data

Organizations and activities <u>not</u> eligible for funding are the following:

- For-profit organizations or businesses
- Private foundations, as defined in section 509(a) of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code
- Organizations that discriminate based on age, ethnicity/race, political affiliation, religion, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, physical or other disability, national origin, or any protected characteristic under local, state, and/or federal law
- Research or project-planning activities
- Support for elite or private sports camps, programs, or teams
- Endowments, memorials, budget deficits, or fundraising activities
- Religious organizations whose sports programs do not have a secular and community focus
- Lobbying, political, or fraternal activities
- Capital projects

<u>Touchstone Life Areas and Services, Opportunities and Supports (SOS) in the Quality Youth Development System (QYDS)</u>

Municipal youth bureaus will be required to report demographics and outcomes through QYDS. The Life Area and SOS selections that will be required in QYDS for YSEF are as follows:

- Life Area: 2PEH Physical and Emotional Health
- SOS: 0232 Year-Round/Seasonal Activities
- Performance measures:
  - How Much: 0232A.1 Number of youth participating (unduplicated)
  - How Well: 0232B.4 Percent of youth completing the program
  - Better Off: 0232C.1 Number and percent reporting they have improved their ability to socialize/interact with peers/family/other members of the community

Allocations are established based on census data in each county, with a minimum allocation of \$10,000 to each county.

In program year 2023-2024, municipal youth bureaus will receive an additional allocation of \$10,344 with the exception of New York City (NYC), which will receive \$10,392. These funds were appropriated based on online gambling revenue and divided evenly among the state's 58 social services districts, with the rounding difference going to NYC. Eligible expenses include one-time investments in infrastructure for physical activity. Examples include improvements to sport fields or courts, building a storage unit to maintain equipment, the purchase of sporting equipment or uniforms, or similar costs. State share is available for 100% of eligible expenditures as included in the approved RAP. Eligible expenses and claiming processes remain unchanged from the previous year. Claims are due September 30, 2025.

#### I. Purpose

The purpose of this Local Commissioners Memorandum (LCM) is to inform local departments of social services (LDSSs) about funding for the Safe Harbour: NY Program for program year January 1, 2024 – December 31, 2024.

#### II. Background

Safe Harbour: NY program funds are intended to support **all** youth identified as trafficked, sexually exploited, or being at risk up to the age of 21. A youth's eligibility for services or support funded through Safe Harbour: NY is not contingent on any demographic factors or other personal characteristics such as immigration status, the source of the referral, or the youth's involvement in child welfare or juvenile justice system(s).

Each LDSS is required to submit to the New York State Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) planning documents including the Sexually Exploited and Trafficked Youth section in the CFSP, the Safe Harbour: NY Program Plan, and the Safe Harbour NY Program Budget. The Safe Harbour: NY plan and budget must be submitted to OCFS using the templates provided. Plans are informed by an assessment of local need as well as guidance provided by OCFS, including but not limited to the <u>Blueprint for Building a Child Welfare Response to Commercially Sexually Exploited and Trafficked Youth (Blueprint)</u>. The Blueprint, and many other resources, can be found on the OCFS website at <a href="https://ocfs.ny.gov/programs/human-trafficking/">https://ocfs.ny.gov/programs/human-trafficking/</a>.

Additional details about completing the CFSP can be found in 21-OCFS-LCM-06, Guidelines and Instructions for Preparing the Child and Family Services Annual Plan Update, and within resource documents embedded within the CFSP portal. The CFSP portal can be accessed at <a href="https://countyplans.ocfs.ny.gov/log-in/">https://countyplans.ocfs.ny.gov/log-in/</a>.

#### III. Program Implications

Each LDSS is required to submit to OCFS the following planning documents: Appendix D: Safe Harbour: NY 2023 Report and 2024 Plan Template, and Appendix E: Safe Harbour: NY 2024 Budget Template. These documents are to be submitted to the county's OCFS Safe Harbour program lead by December 29, 2023. If the LDSS does not know who their program lead is, an inquiry can be made to humantrafficking@ocfs.ny.gov.

Allocations are issued as preliminary. OCFS retains the ability to evaluate programming and spending throughout the program year. Underspent or unclaimed funds are subject to redistribution to other LDSSs based on demonstrated need.

All Safe Harbour funds from the 2024 program year must be expended by January 31, 2025, and all claims must be submitted and approved by the New York State Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA) by March 31, 2025. These deadlines are firm; any unspent funds will be lost and may impact future funding.

#### IV. Claiming

Safe Harbour expenditures must be separately identified and claimed through the RF-17 claim package for special project claiming. The costs must be first identified on the RF-2A claim package as F17 functional costs and reported in the F17 column on the *Cost Allocation Schedule of Payments Administrative Expenses Other Than Salaries* (LDSS-923) and the Schedule D, *DSS Administrative Expenses Allocation and Distribution by Function and Program* (LDSS-2347). After final acceptance of the RF-2A claim package, the individual project costs are then reported under the project label "Safe Harbor 2024" on the RF-17 Worksheet, *Distribution of Allocated Costs to Other Reimbursable Programs* (LDSS-4975A).

Salaries, fringe benefits, staff counts, and central services costs must be directly entered on the RF-17 Worksheet, *Distribution of Allocated Costs to Other Reimbursable Programs* (LDSS-4975A), while overhead costs are automatically brought over from the RF-2A, Schedule D, and distributed based upon the proportion of the number of staff assigned to this project. Employees not working all their time on this project must maintain time studies to support the salary and fringe benefit costs allocated to the program.

Non-salary administrative costs must be reported with the appropriate object of expense(s) on the Summary-Administrative (page 1), Schedule of Payments for Expenses Other Than Salaries for Other Reimbursable Programs (LDSS-923-B).

Program costs must be reported as object of expense 37 - Special Project Program Expense on the Summary - Program (page 2), Schedule of Payments for Expenses Other Than Salaries for Other Reimbursable Programs (LDSS-923-B).

Total project costs, including all costs regardless of state reimbursement, must be reported on the LDSS-4975, *Monthly Statement of Special Project Claims Federal and State Aid (RF-17)*, as 100% state share excluding central services costs, which are local share. Local districts will be reimbursed up to their approved allocation.

To receive reimbursement, claims for eligible "Safe Harbor 2024" expenditures for the period January 1, 2024, through January 31, 2025, must be final accepted in the Automated Claiming System (ACS) by March 31, 2025.

Further instructions for completing time studies, the LDSS-923 and Schedule D, and the RF-17 claim package can be found in Chapters 4, 7, and 18, respectively, of the *Fiscal Reference Manual* (FRM), Volume 3. ## Appendix B: Safe Harbour: NY Allowable Use of Funds, 2024

#### **Target Population:**

Services for sexually exploited children created in each target county pursuant to the Safe Harbour for Exploited Children Act are to be made available to **all** children who have been commercially sexually exploited (CSEC). This is inclusive of all youth, irrespective of gender identity or sexual orientation, up to age 21. Youth are eligible for Safe Harbour: NY funded supports whether they are identified voluntarily; as a condition of an adjournment in contemplation of dismissal issued in criminal court or through procedures or diversion services associated with the Family Court Act (diversion services, child welfare, juvenile delinquency, etc.); or a referral from a local social services agency.<sup>1</sup>

### Fiscal Requirements:

- The **program year** is January 1 December 31, 2024. All Safe Harbour funds must be expended by January 31, 2025, and all claims must be approved by the New York State Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance by March 31, 2025. These deadlines are firm; unspent funds will be lost and may impact future funding.
- Claims must be in alignment with the OCFS-approved program plan and budget.
- Allocations are issued as preliminary. OCFS retains the ability to evaluate programming and spending throughout the program year. Underspent and unclaimed funds are subject to redistribution to other counties based on demonstrated need.

#### Allowable Expenses:

Counties receiving Safe Harbour: NY funds are charged with developing a service system to meet the needs of these youth. Allowable expenses to support this effort include but are not limited to the following:

- 1. Hiring a Safe Harbour coordinator who will provide leadership in developing and implementing program goals and objectives. (Fringe benefits are capped at 30% unless the coordinator is a local department of social services [LDSS] employee).
- 2. Providing case assessment and referral services through a multidisciplinary team approach, including the utilization of Child Advocacy Centers/Multidisciplinary Teams, to interview youth and develop case plans to meet their needs.
- Supporting the salary of per diem and other staff at community agencies that meet the needs of CSEC and at-risk youth, including staff of Runaway and Homeless Youth programs.
- **4.** Creating or further developing a critical team to address the issue of the sexual exploitation of children on a community-wide basis.
- 5. Providing intensive case planning to meet the needs of sexually exploited youth, including but not limited to food, clothing, age-appropriate leadership development and recreational opportunities, transportation, purchase of items to meet emergency needs, disposable cell phones, etc.

- **6.** Providing safe long- and short-term housing, including the use of respite or runaway and homeless youth beds where appropriate.
- 7. Developing and promoting community awareness campaigns about the sexual exploitation and trafficking of youth, including information on the identification and referral to services through community events or other methods of disseminating information (such materials must be approved by OCFS before they are published).
- Maintenance of a county website regarding sexually exploited youth and/or Safe Harbour.
- **9.** Providing supportive services to non-offending family members of trafficked and exploited youth so they are best equipped to support their youth.
- **10.** Travel to participate in appropriate human trafficking trainings, conferences, and stakeholder meetings.
- 11. Partnering with other counties in the region to share information and develop a regional approach to bring awareness, training, and services.
- 12. LDSSs may contract with local partner agencies; however, to be successful, LDSSs must remain engaged in ongoing program planning and implementation.

## Non-Permissible Expenses:

Expenses that **cannot** be purchased using Safe Harbour funds include but are not limited to the following:

- 1. Administrative overhead costs, for example, rent/property leasing, standard utility usage, including electric and power costs, janitorial services, etc.
- 2. Staff fringe benefits exceeding 30% unless program staff are LDSS employees.
- 3. Developing a local hotline for CSEC (contact OCFS to learn about existing hotlines to meet this need).
- Public awareness materials and program brochures that have not received prior approval from OCFS.
- 5. Food and refreshments for adults at meetings and trainings (some exceptions may apply; contact OCFS for more details).
- 6. Other expenses are at the discretion of OCFS.

# Counties who receive Safe Harbour: NY funds are committed to meet the following expectations:

 Under the leadership of the LDSSs, counties with Safe Harbour funds will develop or utilize the following:



- An existing critical team to lead the development of a countywide system response to commercially sexually exploited children and trafficked and at-risk youth (Safe Harbour program). It is strongly recommended that programs use the Blueprint to guide the work of the critical team.
- An asset map and needs assessment related to services that can support youth who have experienced CSEC and human trafficking in a survivorcentered, trauma-responsive manner.
- Standardized tools, including those included in <u>15-OCFS-ADM-16</u>, to screen and assess youth for CSEC and human trafficking experiences.
- Referral pathways to ensure trafficked, exploited, and at-risk youth will be provided an appropriate service response.
- Public awareness campaigns and/or outreach initiatives to contact trafficked, exploited, and at-risk youth. (Note: All public awareness materials require OCFS approval before they may be published with OCFS funds.)
- Offer training opportunities to LDSSs and community-based providers on identifying and providing specialized services to youth who have experienced CSEC and human trafficking.
  - OCFS offers Train-the-Trainer opportunities to capacitate local partners to deliver trainings locally.
  - Youth engagement specialists are available at each OCFS regional office to deliver free training on human trafficking to child welfare professionals.
- Partner counties are further committed to the following:
  - o Participate in regional Safe Harbour meetings (as applicable).
  - o Participate in OCFS's statewide annual conferences.
  - Submit, at OCFS's request, details regarding program spending and claims.
  - Provide a program plan and proposed budged at the beginning of each funding year.
  - Provide a report on its progress at the end of each funding year using the provided template.
  - Respond to OCFS requests for additional information.
- Collect data on all youth identified as commercially sexually exploited, trafficked, or at risk by Safe Harbour: NY-funded agencies in the county, and report this data to OCFS quarterly using the provided template.
  - Data is due to the <u>humantrafficking@ocfs.ny.gov</u> mailbox according to the following schedule:
    - Q1: data from January 1 March 31 (Due 4/22/24)
    - Q2: data from April 1 June 30 (Due 7/22/24)
    - Q3: data from July 1 September 30 (Due 10/21/24)
    - Q4: data from October 1 December 31 (Due 1/20/25)

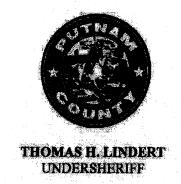

The New York State Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS), through the Division of Child Care Services (DCCS), is pleased to inform you of the OCFS intention to renew the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for your Local Department of Social Services (LDSS) Day Care Registration and Inspection program. This letter serves to provide you with the funding level for the above calendar year. The MOU documents will provide LDSS with the necessary information to complete the Day Care Registration and Inspection Project electronic application. The documents are included in the email attachments that accompany this funding letter.

The disbursement of funding for your registration contract is described below:

Maximum Funding Available: \$95,615.00

- Please be advised that the signature of an authorized LDSS representative is not required at this point. It will only be required once your agency receives the paper copies of the MOU from your program contract manager after DCCS review and approval of your electronic application.
- No scanned or PDF formats will be accepted.

The registration MOU electronic application includes the <u>Appendix D</u> (application pages), <u>Staff Plan Form</u> (all registration staff <u>must</u> be identified by name and title) and the <u>Draft simplified budget(s)</u>. The <u>Appendix C-1 of Standard Performance Levels and Payment Schedule</u> is attached for your review. Note: Performance standards have been amended for 2024.

DCCS has entered the 2024 dates into the Day Care Registration application and budget(s) pages for you from a copy of the 2023 Appendix D, budget(s), and staff plan which you can modify accordingly with current 2024 information. You may save a copy of the completed documents for your files. Please make all necessary amendments to these forms, which has the most current text, and return for processing. If changes occur after the submission of the Appendix D, please notify the DCCS

contract unit immediately. An e-mail address is being requested on the Appendix D for all contacts, including county administrative staff. (You may use your county email if that is more convenient.)

Please do not amend the budget templates; use those forms provided in the attachments and ensure any subcontractor uses the current template.

The LDSS Districts that utilize a subcontractor to conduct the Day Care Registration and Inspection services will need to include in their electronic application an <u>additional</u>, completed subcontractor budget. Please do not amend the budget templates. The subcontractor's budget, if applicable, needs to be included in the LDSS budget in <u>Section B4</u>. The LDSS (and subcontractor's) B section needs either a <u>quarterly or monthly</u> cost in the line item description, in addition to the description for annual expenses over \$500. The OCFS and Total Cost field amounts need to be filled. LDSS has a ceiling of 5% administration cost when there is a subcontractor.

As a reminder, where applicable, the LDSS, as the contractor, is responsible for the day care registration and inspection project. Therefore, should LDSS utilize a subcontractor to perform the Registration services on their behalf, LDSS is required to include in their subcontractor's agreement:

- 1. Every standard performance level of the registration MOU found in Appendix C-1.
- 2. The same rules of confidentiality and professional conduct that are required of all registration staff in the LDSS and the DCCS Regional Offices. It is essential that this language be included.
- 3. DCCS requests the inclusion of the following statement: It is important to note that during the Day Care Registration and Inspection contract period, training will be conducted and attendance is required, as determined by the OCFS DCCS Regional Office.

It is required to provide to the <u>DCCS Regional Office Manager</u> a <u>signed copy</u> of the subcontractor agreement.

It is the legal responsibility of the contractor, LDSS, to provide supervision and oversight for the Day Care Registration and Inspection Project. DCCS requires for each renewal year, LDSS identify a designee/liaison for the Day Care Registration and Inspection Project. It is a requirement that the LDSS staff person is employed at a professional level. Therefore, it is necessary to provide the DCCS Regional Office with the name of the current LDSS registration staff person responsible for the monitoring of the registration activities as reflected on the Appendix D.

The Appendix C-1 performance standards include the requirement that the contractor maintain identified staffing levels that are necessary to conduct the registration activities and that there be specific, designated staff conducting the registration activities. Therefore, all registration staff <u>must</u> be identified by name and title, as well as their percent of time scheduled for the registration project. Abbreviated names and titles are accepted due to format limitations. We developed a means of electronic transfer of personnel budget information to the Staffing Plan form to better assist in this process. The Staffing Plan form matches the size of the personnel columns in the budget for easy electronic copying of staff names and percentage on the project between these two documents. We added "Paste" buttons for your convenience. Save a copy for your records. You will use this form during the year to report staff changes.

It is a project requirement that the registration staffing plan is submitted as part of the application. <u>The Regional Office Manager will review and approve your registration personnel.</u> Staff resumes must be submitted to the <u>DCCS Regional Office Manager</u> for review and approval.

The staffing levels are also reviewed for approval and updated quarterly on the Summary of Quarterly Registration Review Report by the DCCS Regional Office. *It is a quarterly requirement*, that after the end of the quarter, any change in registration personnel be reported to the DCCS Regional Office. However, significant registration staff changes should be reported as they occur, anytime during the year, to the Regional Office on this Staffing Plan form. If any staffing requirements are not satisfactorily met, there will be a reduction of the quarterly performance payment as described in the Registration MOU Appendix C-1.

The performance-based claiming process provides equal quarterly payments (1/4 of the total funding, including cents) for the registration and inspection services upon verification of the standard performance levels being met. After the quarter ends, the appropriate DCCS Regional Office Manager will complete a Summary of Quarterly Registration Review Report. The electronically signed quarterly registration report will be sent to LDSS attention. The DCCS Regional Office report will specify that full quarterly payment will be allocated.

If a performance standard is not met, a payment reduction percentage must be applied as established in the Appendix C-1. A copy of the DRAFT Summary of Quarterly Registration Review Report and Overdue Program Report will be provided to the LDSS contractor and, where applicable, the subcontractor. LDSS will have the opportunity to explain how they were not able to meet the standard due to extraordinary or unforeseen circumstances as stated in the Appendix C-1. After receiving such explanation, the DCCS Regional Office report will specify if the reduction is waived and a full quarterly payment will be allocated, or no waiver issued, and payment reduced.

Upon receiving the completed Summary of Quarterly Registration Review Report electronically, <u>LDSS</u> submits an ink signed voucher/claim to the appropriate DCCS Regional Office Manager for the exact amount (including cents) that is in the report. You may create a claim template with standard information for your convenience. However, the claim will need to be printed and ink signed for this Office to process. <u>Please use the Office of the State Comptroller claiming form AC3253-S (2012).</u>

The amount on the claim needs to reflect the <u>exact amount (including cents)</u> shown on the quarterly report or Appendix C-1 (if there is no penalty). <u>There is no rounding to the nearest dollar.</u> Place data inside of the Vendor Box. This ink signed voucher/claim for payment will be scanned by the DCCS Regional Office Manager to the Registration Contract Manager at DCCS Central Office for the processing of the quarterly payment.

Your contribution in this process cannot be overstated. All efforts to submit your completed registration package <u>electronically</u> by <u>December 1, 2023</u> or earlier will be greatly appreciated. It is essential to take into consideration that the MOU processing time frame <u>may need a two-month minimum</u> from the time that the MOU and budget are reviewed and approved by DCCS, and LDSS returns by mail the authorized signed documents. The sooner your registration renewal package is returned to the DCCS Program Contract Manager and Regional Office Manager, the sooner the review and approval process can begin.

Please complete all documents in the electronic application and submit <u>the Appendix D</u>, <u>staff plan and budget documents</u> electronically and simultaneously to:

This memo is to explain the budget deficit with preschool evaluations and itinerant services for Early Intervention. The accounts currently do not have enough money to cover the remainder of the 2023 vouchers. This is hard to forecast as we cannot predict how many children will be referred to the Early Intervention program and the Committee of Preschool Special Education (CPSE).

#### PRESCHOOL:

The New York State Education Department sets the rates and may change the rates at any given time. The increase in the rates below began on July 1, 2023.

The number of children being referred to Preschool for an evaluation to determine eligibility has increased. Please also note that the Committee of Preschool Special Education Chair determines what evaluations are to be conducted, depending on the family's concerns. However, it is regulation that each child receives at least a psychological, educational, and a social history evaluation. Bilingual evaluations rates are higher than the amount shown below in the chart.

 The monies to cover the deficit for Preschool Evaluation can be taken from excess in the school district administration budget.

Preschool Center- based program requires additional money due to the increase of children needing and attending a center-based program. At this time \$240,000 is needed and can be taken from the Preschool itinerant budget. In 2023, more children were attending center-based programs and less children were receiving home services. This will have no fiscal impact on the County.

#### **EARLY INTERVENTION:**

Early Intervention the budget for itinerant services is also short \$88,000 for the 2023 year. In 2023, we averaged 200 children in the program. As we evaluated these children most are demonstrating delays in three areas of development. (Cognitive, Communication, and Social Emotional) The needs of these children and the severity of delays are more intense. This level need leads to increases in services to assist the families and help the children meet their potential. We are requesting to move monies from Early Intervention evaluations, center-based, and assistive technology to cover the deficit of Early Intervention itinerant services. This will have no impact on the County.

This memo is to explain the budget deficit with preschool evaluations and itinerant services for Early Intervention. The accounts currently do not have enough money to cover the remainder of the 2023 vouchers. This is hard to forecast as we cannot predict how many children will be referred to the Early Intervention program and the Committee of Preschool Special Education (CPSE).

#### PRESCHOOL:

The New York State Education Department sets the rates and may change the rates at any given time. The increase in the rates below began on July 1, 2023.

The number of children being referred to Preschool for an evaluation to determine eligibility has increased. Please also note that the Committee of Preschool Special Education Chair determines what evaluations are to be conducted, depending on the family's concerns. However, it is regulation that each child receives at least a psychological, educational, and a social history evaluation. Bilingual evaluations rates are higher than the amount shown below in the chart.

 The monies to cover the deficit for Preschool Evaluation can be taken from excess in the school district administration budget.

Preschool Center- based program requires additional money due to the increase of children needing and attending a center-based program. At this time \$240,000 is needed and can be taken from the Preschool itinerant budget. In 2023, more children were attending center-based programs and less children were receiving home services. This will have no fiscal impact on the County.

#### **EARLY INTERVENTION:**

Early Intervention the budget for itinerant services is also short \$88,000 for the 2023 year. In 2023, we averaged 200 children in the program. As we evaluated these children most are demonstrating delays in three areas of development. (Cognitive, Communication, and Social Emotional) The needs of these children and the severity of delays are more intense. This level need leads to increases in services to assist the families and help the children meet their potential. We are requesting to move monies from Early Intervention evaluations, center-based, and assistive technology to cover the deficit of Early Intervention itinerant services. This will have no impact on the County.

#### APPROVAL/LITIGATION SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT / MATTHEW RIVERA V. COUNTY OF **PUTNAM**

WHEREAS, on or about June 29, 2020, at approximately 2:00 a.m., Plaintiff Matthew Rivera, was walking on the Maybrook Trailways at or near where it crosses the East Bank of the Croton River in Brewster, New York, when he tripped and fell from the train trestle he was walking on to the

ground far below sustaining severe injuries; and

WHEREAS, on or about September 16, 2020 Plaintiff Matthew Rivera commenced action against the County of Putnam, Metro North Commuter Railroad and the Metropolitan Transportation Authority in Supreme Court, Putnam County alleging that his injuries were caused, inter alia, by the defendants' failure to properly secure the train track and trestle, inadequate lighting in the area, and improperly maintained fence whereby Plaintiff obtained access to the train tracks and trestle; and

WHEREAS, Plaintiff sought recovery for compensatory damages in an undetermined

amount as well as costs, disbursements, attorney's fees and interest; and

WHEREAS, the Claims Committee for the New York Municipal Insurance Reciprocal (NYMIR) recently arrived at a settlement value for this case of two hundred and fifty thousand (\$250,000.00) dollars; and

WHEREAS, Plaintiff agreed to a settlement with the County, subject to the Legislature's approval, in which the County agreed to pay Plaintiff the sum of two hundred and fifty thousand

(\$250,000.00) dollars; and

WHEREAS, the County Attorney, the County's outside counsel, James A. Randazzo, Esq., and NYMIR's claims representative have recommended the settlement as an alternative to trial; and

WHEREAS, counsel for the County of Putnam has in fact settled the matter with Plaintiff for the sum of two hundred and fifty thousand (\$250,000.00) dollars, and Plaintiff has executed the required General Release which, upon approval by the Legislature will be filed with the Court, thereby discontinuing this matter and allowing Plaintiff to receive his settlement payment in the agreed upon amount; and

WHEREAS, the aforementioned settlement is in the public interest and avoids the costs of further litigation, additional attorney's fees and costs and the risk of a high jury verdict; now

therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the proposed settlement of this matter for the sum of two hundred and fifty

thousand (\$250,000.00) dollars is hereby approved; and

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is hereby authorized to sign any required settlement documents on behalf of the County including a Settlement Agreement and Release with respect thereto.

Pursuant to Section 11 of the County's Deposit and Investment Policies, enclosed is the report on the County's Deposit and Investments for fourth quarter ending December 31, 2023.

Interest income through **December 31, 2023** (unaudited), was \$6,420,994.85 vs. \$1,388,042.22 for **December 31, 2022**. For the second consecutive year in a row, Federal Reserve Rates were at their highest level within the last 15 years. At the beginning of the year, rates were between 4.50% and 4.75%. As of this report, the rates were between 5.25%-5.50% with the feds holding rates steady as inflation is settling down. Most recently, the Federal Open Market Committee meeting in December indicated that the Federal Reserve would start cutting rates in 2024 as much as three times, four cuts in fiscal year ending 2025 and another three more reductions in fiscal year ending 2026 that would eventually bring the interest rates back down to 2.00% to 2.25%.

Meanwhile, the County has been able to take advantage of investment options including NYCLASS Prime, NYLAF, NY Muni-Trust and short and long-term Certificates of Deposits by laddering twelve (12) and eighteen (18) month CDs based on cash management strategies provided by the County's Cash Management advisor, Three Plus One.
