The meeting was called to order at 6:30p.m. by Chairman Gouldman and he led in the Pledge of Allegiance. Upon roll call, Legislators Castellano, Montgomery and Chairman Gouldman were present.

Item #3 - Acceptance/ Physical Services Meeting Minutes/ October 12th and November 16, 2023

Chairman Gouldman stated the minutes were accepted as submitted.

Item #4 - Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A072/ Repurpose of US Department of Transportation, Federal Transit Administration Remaining Section 5339 Funds/ (FFY2015 NY & Danbury, CT)/ Supplement Funding For Access to Empire State Trail Project/ Commissioner of Finance Michael Lewis

Chairman Gouldman stated Commissioner of Finance Michael Lewis is present to speak to this item.

Commissioner of Finance Michael Lewis stated this is a repurposing of the Federal and State funds from the ADA Transit Accessibility Program to the Empire Trail Access.

Commissioner of Planning, Development, and Public Transportation Barbara Barosa stated this is the balance of funding from a sidewalk project. She stated the funding is being repurposed to a similar project.

Chairman Gouldman made a motion to Approve Budgetary Amendment 23A072/ Repurpose of US Department of Transportation, Federal Transit Administration Remaining Section 5339 Funds/ (FFY2015 NY & Danbury, CT)/ Supplement Funding For Access to Empire State Trail Project; Seconded by Legislator Montgomery. All in favor.

Item #5 – Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A074/ Reimbursement from State Farm Mutual Automobile Insurance Company/ Damage to Guide Rail on Stoneleigh Avenue/ Risk Manager Mat Bruno

Risk Manager Mat Bruno stated in addition to the Accident and Incident Reports he will be sending a Property Damage Report. He stated it will include updated and current information when a property damage claim comes into the County's Risk Office. He explained that he and the Commissioner of DPW are working together to get police reports related to guard rail and/or property damage along County Roadways. He stated if a police report is generated, he can work with the Sheriff's Department and the Commissioner of DPW to get the necessary information needed to submit a claim for reimbursement from the corresponding Insurance Company. He stated this is the first reimbursement received. He stated this is new money coming in that in the past the County did not receive. He stated the reimbursement checks, when received, will be sent to Commissioner of Finance and the funding will be put in the proper account. He stated there are several that he is currently working on. He stated the County recently received another reimbursement check for \$7,700 from Progressive. He stated he wanted to bring this good news that they are working on getting property damage reimbursement back to the County for services, materials and labor costs that the County was already doing.

Chairman Gouldman stated his appreciation for Risk Manager Burno's action in seeking reimbursement funding, which was not done before.

Risk Manager Mat Bruno stated the monthly spread sheet he will submit to the Legislature will show what he is working on. He stated he started this work in November of 2023, and to date have received \$17,720.54 in reimbursement.

Legislator Ellner requested why the total on the budgetary amendment is different from the total listed in the backup.

Commissioner of Finance Mike Lewis stated that he will look into it. He stated if there needs to be an edit he will have it for the Audit & Administration and the Year End Meetings tomorrow.

Commissioner of DPW Thomas Feighery expressed his appreciation for the assistance and cooperation from the Town of Carmel, Town of Kent Police Departments, and the Sheriff's Department.

Chairman Gouldman made a motion to Approve Budgetary Amendment 23A074/ Reimbursement from State Farm Mutual Automobile Insurance Company/ Damage to Guide Rail on Stoneleigh Avenue; Seconded by Legislator Castellano. All in favor.

Item #6 - Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A075/ Funding from New York Metropolitan Transportation Council (NYMTC) Regarding Federal Transit Funding for Federal Fiscal Year 2023/ Commissioner of Finance Michael Lewis Commissioner of Planning, Development, and Public Transportation Barbara Barosa stated this is Formula Funding. She stated this is to adjust the budget line. She stated the County received more funding than what was allocated for the year.

Chairman Gouldman made a motion to Approve Budgetary Amendment 23A075/ Funding from New York Metropolitan Transportation Council (NYMTC) Regarding Federal Transit Funding for Federal Fiscal Year 2023; Seconded by Legislator Castellano. All in favor.

Item #7 - Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A085/ Funding for the Sprout Brook Road Bridge Replacement Project/ Deputy Commissioner of DPW Joseph Bellucci

Deputy Commissioner DPW Joseph Bellucci stated when the bids were received for this project back in September of 2023, the low bid was higher than the Engineer's Estimate, thus necessitating this request. He stated this project is scheduled to begin in the early Spring of 2024.

Legislator Montgomery stated this is a project that is much anticipated. She stated representatives from the County came to a Community Meeting and spoke to the project and also addressed questions from the residents. She stated they also promised that they would be back once the engineering was reviewed, completed and the project was ready to begin. She questioned if that promise still stands with the Continental Village Homeowners Association. She stated she can provide the DPW Commissioner and Deputy Commissioner the Continental Village Homeowners Association monthly Homeowners Association (HOA) meeting schedule. She stated they are concerned about the impact the work on this project will cause in terms of traffic, school buses etc.

Commissioner of DPW Thomas Feighery stated they would need to meet with them in early March of 2024.

Legislator Montgomery stated she will look into when their HOA meeting is in March and work to coordinate it with Commissioner Feighery.

Chairman Gouldman made a motion to Approve Budgetary Amendment 23A085/ Funding for the Sprout Brook Road Bridge Replacement Project; Seconded by Legislator Montgomery. All in favor.

Item #8 - Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A086/ Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act and NY & CT American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funding to Support Transit Operations and Maintenance at Aging Transit Facility/

Commissioner Department of Planning, Development and Public Transportation Barbara Barosa

Commissioner Department of Planning, Development and Public Transportation Barbara Barosa explained this budgetary request involves funding that was allocated for transportation, which was ARPA, COVID Relief funding. She stated the funding must be used on operations or maintenance. She stated the County would like to utilize said funding at the County's Transit Facility in the areas of operations and maintenance, in accordance with the requirements.

Chairman Gouldman made a motion to Approve Budgetary Amendment 23A086/ Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act and NY & CT American Rescue Plan Act Funding to Support Transit Operations and Maintenance at Aging Transit Facility; Seconded by Legislator Montgomery. All in favor.

Item #9 - Approval/ Authorizing the Implementation of Funding in The First Instance 100% of the Federal-Aid and State "Marchiselli" Program-Aid Eligible Costs of a Transportation Federal – Aid Project, and Appropriating Funds for the Construction and Construction Inspection Phases for the Completion of PIN 8757.48 – Peekskill Hollow Road Renovation Project/ Commissioner of DPW Thomas Feighery

Commissioner of Finance Mike Lewis stated in working with the County's contacts in the New York Metropolitan Transportation Council (NYMTC) the Putnam County secured Federal funding in the amount of \$7,826,000 to put towards the Peekskill Hollow Road Renovation project. He explained that a 20% match is required. He stated in May of 2023 the County submitted a \$4 million bond for said project. He stated of that \$4 million, \$2 million will be used to subsidize this local match requirement. He stated the remaining \$2 million will be rescinded and the NYMTC funding will be applied to the Peekskill Hollow Road Renovation.

Chairman Gouldman commented that since the new County Administration has taken over, the Peekskill Hollow Road Renovation project is moving at a fast pace and is progressing very nicely. He also recognized DPW Commissioner Feighery and his staff for their work that contributed to the opening of the Oregon Corners Bridge which was reopened today. He stated that is a very welcomed action by the residents and visitors of Putnam Valley.

Legislator Montgomery stated her appreciation of the support of her Legislative Colleagues, which also contributed to the Peekskill Hollow Road Renovation progressing forward.

Chairman Gouldman echoed Legislator Montgomery's comments.

Legislator Jonke stated his appreciation to Commissioner of Finance Mike Lewis for working to secure this funding. He stated this will result in a savings of millions of dollars for the taxpayers.

Chairman Gouldman made a motion to Approve Authorizing the Implementation of Funding in The First Instance 100% of the Federal-Aid and State "Marchiselli" Program-Aid Eligible Costs of a Transportation Federal – Aid Project, and Appropriating Funds for the Construction and Construction Inspection Phases for the Completion of PIN 8757.48 – Peekskill Hollow Road Renovation Project; Seconded by Legislator Montgomery. All in favor.

Item #10 - Approval/ Budgetary Amendment 23A088/ Distribution of Congested Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement (CMAQ) Funds in connection with the Peekskill Hollow Road Renovation Project/ Commissioner of Finance Michael Lewis or Director of Purchasing John Tully

Commissioner of Finance Mike Lewis stated this budgetary is putting the funds in the correct budget lines and it is related to what was discussed in agenda item #9.

Commissioner DPW Thomas Feighery stated he would like to recognize Commissioner of Planning, Development, and Public Transportation Barbara Barosa and Director of Purchasing John Tully, for their efforts and involvement in securing these funds. He stated they serve as the County's representative on the NYMTC Board.

Chairman Gouldman made a motion to Approve Budgetary Amendment 23A088/ Distribution of Congested Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement (CMAQ) Funds in connection with the Peekskill Hollow Road Renovation Project; Seconded by Legislator Castellano. All in favor.

Item #11 - Approval/ Capital Project – 23CP18/ Purchasing Department Offices Renovation/ Commissioner of DPW Thomas Feighery

Commissioner DPW Thomas Feighery stated this is a Capital Project (CP) this year. He stated they are updating the out-of-date County Mailroom and adding an office and updating the Purchasing Department.

Chairman Gouldman made a motion to Approve Capital Project – 23CP18/ Purchasing Department Offices Renovation; Seconded by Legislator Montgomery. All in favor.

Item #12 - Approval/ Capital Project – 23CP19/ Tilly Foster Farm Building #6 (the Cantina)/ Funding for the Demolition, Razing of Building #6 and Related Site and Utility Work/ Commissioner of Department of Public Works Thomas Feighery

Legislator Castellano requested an update on the building across the street from Tilly Foster Farm along Route 312.

Commissioner of DPW Thomas Feighery stated the Watershed Agricultural Council (WAC) has a new Board and they have expressed an interest in taking that building. He stated the County has offered to take down the structure for them. He stated the County will continue its negotiations with WAC and anticipate it will be on the WAC agenda for the February Meeting that is scheduled with Putnam County. He stated this Capital Project funding request is to cover the cost of the rubbish removal related to the knock down of Building #6, and the utility tie-ins. He stated this is the location where Cornell Cooperative has been approved to erect a new structure on the Tilly Foster Farm property.

Legislator Montgomery stated she has been vocal in her criticism of the County spending any more money on Tilly Foster Farm. She explained in sight of the future use of this new structure and the plans for education that will take place in it by Cornell Cooperative, she is in support of it. She stated she did tour the original Building #6 and is in full support of the fact that it had to be knocked down. She stated she is in support of this request.

Chairman Gouldman made a motion to Approve the Capital Project – 23CP19/ Tilly Foster Farm Building #6 (the Cantina)/ Funding for the Demolition, Razing of Building #6 and Related Site and Utility Work; Seconded by Legislator Montgomery. All in favor.

Item #13 - Approval/ Grant Application/ State and Municipal Facilities Grant Program/
Putnam County Office Building ADA Compliant Ramp/ No Matching Funds/
Commissioner Department of Planning, Development and Public Transportation Barbara
Barosa

Commissioner Department of Planning, Development and Public Transportation Barbara Barosa expressed thanks to Senator Harckham for his efforts to make Putnam County a recipient of a \$50,000 grant. She stated these funds will be used to construct an ADA Compliant Ramp at the front entrance of the County Office Building (COB). She stated this will allow those who need to make use of an ADA entrance to have the option of the ADA entrance that brings them through the back door of the COB into the ground level of the building, which they then utilize the elevator or have them come through the front door entrance of the COB that brings them into the main entrance where and elevator is also accessible.

Legislator Nacerino stated she is happy to see that this will be done. She stated in her opinion it is well overdue. She expressed her appreciation to Senator Harckham for providing the funding.

Legislator Montgomery expressed her appreciation to Senator Harckham and for this project of making the COB easily accessible to everyone.

Chairman Gouldman made a motion to Approve Grant Application/ State and Municipal Facilities Grant Program/ Putnam County Office Building ADA Compliant Ramp; Seconded by Legislator Castellano. All in favor.

Item #14 - Approval/ Adoption Putnam County Complete Streets Policy/ Commissioner Department of Planning, Development and Public Transportation Barbara Barosa

Commissioner Department of Planning, Development and Public Transportation Barbara Barosa stated this is part of the County's Climate Smart Initiative. She stated one of the measures they would like to do is address the Complete Streets, which is a policy of looking at the County's roadway projects through the lens of looking at all avenues of transportation: pedestrians, bicycles and to make sure the design allows everyone to utilize the roadways.

Legislator Montgomery stated for the record she brought forward a similar policy and an expert from Dutchess County to a meeting in 2022. She stated she believes because it was her proposal it was never brought forward. She stated she appreciates that Commissioner Barosa has brought this forward, and she will be in complete favor of this. She continued to speak to her frustration with the fact that the County did not move forward with this program last year which resulted in the loss of incentives that the Complete Street Policies and Climate Smart Programs offer.

Legislator Ellner questioned if the focus will be on new roadway projects or old, and will the County have to spend money to bring all the roads up to this policy.

Commissioner Department of Planning, Development and Public Transportation Barbara Barosa explained this is a design technique. She stated it makes sure that Planners and Engineers are looking at everything when evaluating projects. She clarified it is not required that the County implement measures.

Chairman Gouldman facilitated further discussion on this matter.

Chairman Gouldman made a motion to Approve/ Adoption Putnam County Complete Streets Policy; Seconded by Legislator Montgomery. All in favor.

Item #15 - Approval/ Putnam County's Proposed Program Plan in Conformance With and As Required by the U.S. Department of Transportation and Title VI Regulations/ Commissioner Department of Planning, Development and Public Transportation Barbara Barosa

Commissioner Department of Planning, Development and Public Transportation Barbara Barosa stated this is an update to the County's Title VI plan, which is required by the Federal Transportation Administration (FTA). She stated that the County's transportation system is operated fairly and equally with consideration of all people.

Chairman Gouldman made a motion to Approve/ Putnam County's Proposed Program Plan in Conformance With and As Required by the U.S. Department of Transportation and Title VI Regulations; Seconded by Legislator Castellano. All in favor.

AUTHORIZING THE IMPLEMENTATION, AND FUNDING IN THE FIRST INSTANCE 100% OF THE FEDERAL-AID AND STATE "MARCHISELLI" PROGRAM-AID ELIGIBLE COSTS, OF A TRANSPORTATION FEDERAL-AID PROJECT, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFORE (Fair St Reconstruction)

WHEREAS, a Project for Fair Street (C.R. 60) Reconstruction is eligible for funding under Title 23 U.S. Code, as amended, that calls for the apportionment of the costs, such program to be borne at the ratio of 80% Federal funds and 20% non-federal funds; and

WHEREAS, Putnam County desires to advance the Project by making a commitment of 100% of the non-federal share of the costs of Construction and Construction Inspection work.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Putnam County Legislature, duly convened does hereby

RESOLVE, that the Putnam County Legislature hereby approves the abovesubject project; and it is hereby further

RESOLVED, that the Putnam County Legislature hereby authorizes Putnam County to pay in the first instance one hundred (100%) percent of the federal and non-federal share of the cost of Construction and Construction Inspection work for the Project or portions thereof; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the sum of \$24,705,000 (\$26,505,000 minus the previous \$1,800,000) is hereby appropriated from the Putnam County capital budget line number 05 55197000 53000 51622 and made available to cover the cost of participation in the above phases of the Project; and it is further

RESOLVED, that in the event the full federal and non-federal share costs of the Project exceeds the amount appropriated above, the Putnam County Legislature shall convene as soon as possible to appropriate said excess amount immediately upon the notification by the Putnam County Executive thereof, and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Putnam County Executive, on behalf of Putnam County, be and is hereby authorized to execute all necessary Agreements, certifications or reimbursement requests for Federal Aid and/or applicable Marchiselli Aid on behalf of Putnam County with the New York State Department of Transportation in connection with the advancement or approval of the Project and providing for the administration of the Project and Putnam County's first instance funding of project costs and permanent funding of the local share of federal-aid and state-aid eligible Project costs and all Project costs within appropriations therefore that are not so eligible, and it is further

RESOLVED, that the County Executive, with the advice and assistance of the County Attorney, is authorized to finalize and execute all necessary documents, including, without limitation, the State/Local Agreement, in connection with the Project; and it is further

RESOLVED, that in addition to the Putnam County Executive, the Commissioner of the Department of Public Works and the Commissioner of Finance are also authorized, with the consent of the County Executive, to execute any necessary Agreements or certifications on behalf of Putnam County with the New York State Department of Public Transportation in connection with the advancement or approval of the project identified in the State/Local Agreement; and be it further

RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be filed with the New York State Commissioner of Transportation by attaching it to any necessary Agreement in connection with the Project, and it is further

RESOLVED, this Resolution shall take effect immediately.

Utilization of WQIP Funding for Equipment Purchases

Chairman Ellner,

The Department of Public Works is respectfully requesting The Committee's consideration for the use of WQIP (Water Quality Investment Program) funding to acquire MS4 maintenance equipment which includes a Multi-Use Vactor Truck and two (2) Vacall Street Sweepers to maintain roads and catch basins. The Department of Public Works intends to be the record owner of all three vehicles but will consider usage requests from various municipalities within Putnam County per the established Intermunicipal Agreements (IMA).

The Putnam County Department of Public Works maintains approximately 234 lane miles of roads throughout the County as well as 265 drainage structures, all of which require routine maintenance and cleanout. To minimize the adverse impacts on lakes, streams and the water supply, The Putnam County Department of Public Works attempts to clean out catch basins no less than semi-annually throughout the County, Given that the current Vactor truck and sweeper are past their useful lives and are unreliable, replacing them with newer items will positively impact both the operational and maintenance responsibilities associated with the Department's Stormwater Management Program (SWMP). 1. THE AGREEMENT. RE: Catch Basin and Multi-Purpose Vacuum Truck

Dear Mr. Eldridge:

This letter is offered to seek your support for the Town of Carmel's purchase of a_Catch Basin and Multi-Purpose Vacuum Truck utilizing Water Quality Improvement Program (WQIP) funding. Provided below is background information on the Town Highway Department's operations, and justification as to the need for this unit.

Our highway department vehicle fleet includes a Vac-All Vacuum Truck, which was originally purchased in 1995 and has been in continuous use since that time. While we have attempted to maintain the unit in a safe operating condition, it is no longer on the road due to extreme deterioration and wear of the engine and it's braking system, body and vacuum system components. In our efforts to maintain the equipment in service, we brought the unit to Empire Equipment, who has advised us that it would cost approximately \$60,000 to repair. However, given the extremely poor condition of the vehicle, and given the fact that it is approaching the end of its useful life, it is no longer warranted to continue to invest money in the unit in the futile hope of keeping it operating.

The Town's highway department maintains approximately 180 miles of roads in Town, and well over 3,500 drainage structures, all of which require routine maintenance and clean-out. In our interest to minimize adverse impacts to our local lakes and streams, the Highway Department attempts to clean out catch basins no less than annually throughout the entire Town. More importantly, within the drainage systems outletting into our Lake communities we strive to accomplish this on a more frequent, semi-annual basis. Further, for many years we had an arrangement with NYSDOT to clean out their catch basins along NYS Route 6N, and their large stormwater structures which were installed to capture and trap sediment from stormwater run-off prior to discharge into Lake Mahopac. Unfortunately, this cooperative agreement was terminated some years ago, due to budget reductions at the State level.

REFERENCE: Catch Basin and Multi-Purpose Vacuum Truck

The purchase of a new catch basin and multi-purpose Vacuum truck would allow the Town to once again initiate routine clean-out of catch basins throughout our highway system. We have also been in contact with NYSDOT staff at their maintenance offices in Kent, and they strongly support our purchase of this unit. Further, if we are successful in securing funding, DOT has expressed interest in again initiating an inter-agency agreement to have the Town of Carmel Highway Department clean their catch basin structures along NYS Route 6N and elsewhere. This synergy would greatly multiply the water quality benefits derived, and truly allow this purchase to serve greater and wider watershed benefits.

It must be additionally pointed out that due to budgetary constraints within the Town of Carmel, it is still necessary for us to use sand/salt mixture on 50% of our plowing routes, with the attendant increase in product being applied to these roadways. This fact only makes it that much more vital to routinely maintain our structures so as to prevent excessive build-up of sediment in our lakes and streams.

Lastly, it must also be noted that in 2002 the Town of Carmel was originally approached by the County when it was considering the purchase of Vac-All Trucks for compliance with the maintenance requirements that resulted from the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) mandate. At that time our existing vacuum truck was functioning adequately to meet these maintenance requirements. That is no longer the case. We are also aware that the Towns of Kent and Southeast, and including the County, have been provided with Vac-All type trucks with resources from the East-of-Hudson (EOH) Funds in the past. With the present inoperative condition of our vacuum truck, this new equipment is urgently needed by the Town of Carmel to maintain our existing (and future) storm sewer and catch basin infrastructure for MS4 compliance.

To assist you in your understanding of our Highway Department's specific needs regarding this equipment, we have enclosed specifications for a Catch Basin and Multi-Purpose Vacuum Truck that would suit the Town's requirements. Also provided is pricing on the intended unit, for your information and use.

It is hoped that you will support our efforts to secure WQIP funding for this worthy and worthwhile purchase, and so allow us to once again maintain our drainage facilities so as to improve the quality of the Town's many lakes and streams. I trust that this is adequate for your needs. However, should you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact me.

I am attaching two requests for MS4 maintenance equipment from the Putnam County Department of Highways, for a Street Sweeper, and the Town of Carmel for their Highway Department, to acquire a Vac-All Truck to maintain roads and catch basins.

This equipment is eligible for funding from the East-of-Hudson funds, Water Quality Investment Program, (WQIP.) Previously, three (3) Vac- All Trucks were purchased with WQIP funds for the use of the Towns of Kent and Southeast and the Putnam County Department of Highways. The above requested equipment helps the EOH community to maintain water quality protection compliance under the MS4 mandate.

The specifications and costs for this equipment are outlined in the attached documentation.

The Vac-All Truck that the Town of Carmel is requesting costs \$240,000.00, which is approximately \$3000.00 less than the cost for each unit purchased in 2002.

The Street Sweeper has already been bid by the County; the cost with the necessary options comes to \$173,265.00.

I will prepare a proposed resolution, for these acquisitions, via the WQIP funding process.

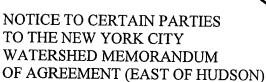

Pursuant to Section 107 of the New York City Watershed Memorandum of Agreement of January 21, 1997 (hereinafter "MOA"), Putnam County hereby notifies you of its preliminary decision to fund the purchase of a Vac-All Vacuum Truck for the Town of Carmel to further protect the water quality. It is the County's preliminary determination to use East of Hudson (hereinafter "EOH") "Water Quality Investment Program" funds pursuant to Section 140 of the MOA. You have fifteen (15) days from the date of mailing of this notice to object to the County's preliminary decision or to petition the County for an additional fifteen (15) day period to raise an objection. Objections must be made pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 107(f) of the MOA.

WHEREAS, the County Executive has given his approval for the expenditure of EOH funds to pay for said equipment; and

WHEREAS, the Putnam County Legislature has reviewed this proposed acquisition and has found that it is consistent with the requirements and directives contained in the MOA with respect to the appropriate expenditure of the use of earnings of the EOH Funds; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Putnam County Legislature hereby approves the use of earnings on the EOH Funds to purchase one (1) Vac-All Vacuum Truck for the Town of Carmel to further protect water quality; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this expenditure shall not exceed two hundred forty thousand (\$240,000.00) dollars; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Putnam County Legislature shall transmit the "Right of Objection" letter required under the terms of the MOA; and be it further

RESOLVED, that upon conclusion of the objection process, the Commissioner of Finance is authorized to distribute the approved funds from the earnings on the EOH Funds accordingly.
